



Dr. Conrad Mbewe serves as pastor of [Kabwata Baptist Church \(KBC\)](#) in Lusaka, Zambia. Having previously trained and worked as a mining engineer in the Zambian copper mines, he answered God's call and became pastor of KBC in 1987. KBC is presently overseeing the establishment of about 20 new Reformed Baptist churches in Zambia and other surrounding African countries. The church also serves as the hub church for Campus Outreach Zambia, a partner with our own Campus Outreach Memphis.

Mbewe holds a PhD, MPhil and an MA in Pastoral Theology from the University of Pretoria. He is a frequent conference speaker throughout Africa and around the world, sometimes referred to by others as the "Spurgeon of Africa." Being a keen writer, Mbewe serves as the editor of *Reformation Zambia* magazine, maintains a column in a weekly national Zambian newspaper, and writes his own blog, *A Letter from Kabwata*. He has also written about 40 booklets in Africa and four books that have been published internationally through Langham Partnership, including [Foundations for the Flock](#) and [Pastoral Preaching: Building a People for God](#).

Mbewe is a Council member of The Gospel Coalition Africa and the Founding Chancellor of the [African Christian University](#) in Lusaka. He and his wife, Felistas, have six adult children.
