





# Weekly Prayer Focus

World Missions—Shayla: Shayla has been serving at La Misión Church in Buenos Aires, Argentina, for the past year and a half. She works primarily with youth and young adults through sports and recreational outreach, as well as discipleship groups. The church has experienced significant growth this year, including the launch of a new middle school ministry. Many of the older students Shayla mentors are now helping lead and coordinate that ministry. The soccer outreach has also expanded, with consistent attendance allowing the group to organize larger games. In addition, Shayla is sharing Christ with members of her running club, who recently formed a small group to have deeper conversations about faith. Please pray for the Lord to encourage and deepen the faith of the youth and young adults at La Mision.

Mission Memphis–Refugee Empowerment Program: Refugee Empowerment Program (REP) is a Memphis-based nonprofit serving refugees and immigrants. Founded in 2002 by a Sudanese refugee mother and a member of Second, it remains the region's only ethnic community–based organization. REP empowers newcomers through tailored programs that educate, equip, and encourage them as they integrate into American culture and pursue personal and professional goals. Praise God for the new volunteers who are eager to stand against the harm being done to immigrants, and for the resilience of refugees—their example is a blessing to our city. Pray for the physical and emotional well-being of refugee families: that God's love and grace would be evident through the staff as they work to provide food distributions for those in need, and that REP would find the funding needed to navigate this challenging season of frozen or reduced grants.

**2PC Ministry–Communications:** Led by Robb Roaten, our communications team equips the ministries of Second in a variety of ways—from weekly email and social media campaigns, production of printed materials, development of video resources, and promoting our ministries outside the walls of Second, to managing the audio/visual and technology needs of the church. Please pray for the Lord to give the team wisdom as they pursue clear communication of the mission and vision of Second to our members. Pray also that the Lord would bless their efforts and use them as effective tools for reaching and engaging people in our community. Finally, pray for endurance and good health for the team during this busy season.

Contributions mailed to the church must be postmarked by the U.S. Postal Service by December 31, 2025, to qualify as a charitable gift for the 2025 tax year. Mailed envelopes postmarked after December 31, 2025 must be reported as a 2026 gift, regardless of the date on the enclosed check.
