





## Weekly Prayer Focus

**World Missions–Maddie:** Upon graduating from college, Maddie participated in the CO LEAD program, serving two years in SE Asia. While serving in a country where there is less than 2% professing faith in Christ, Maddie made the commitment to serve as a long-term staff member. She now serves as the LEAD Coordinator, helping the 2-year staff transition to life in SE Asia. This involves helping short-term members as they leave, and new ones join the team. She asked for prayer for team unity, good health, both physically and mentally, language development, and most importantly, that the Lord would strengthen them as they spend time in the Word and in prayer.

Domestic Missions–Christ Community Health Services: Christ Community Health Services (CCHS) is a faith-based, federally qualified health center that provides high-quality healthcare to the underserved in the context of distinctively Christian service. They recognize that Jesus Christ is the true healer and the source of their ability to serve patients and their communities. CCHS's vision is to reach 1,000 souls through their platform of healthcare services, aiming to serve at least 71,000 unique individuals annually. Pray for the Lord to establish a solid foundation through the organizational stability efforts (personnel, finances, and ministry plans). Pray also for the salvation of 1,000 people through CCHS or partnered efforts. Finally, pray for sufficient funding to fulfill campus improvement and expansion needs.

**2PC Ministry–Shine Ministry:** The Shine Ministry at Second strives to effectively communicate the gospel to individuals with physical and intellectual disabilities, and to eliminate barriers that prevent them and their families from living in community with the body of Christ. Please pray for their basketball season that is currently underway. Pray for the athletes, families, and coaches—that they may build meaningful friendships, enjoy the game, and encourage one another along the way. Pray that our church would grow in its commitment to be accessible and inclusive to those affected by disability. May the Shine Ministry continue to be a source of support, offering a loving community that reflects the heart of the gospel in both word and action.
