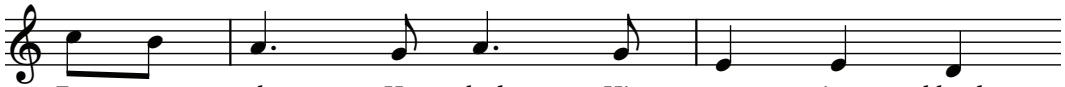

Weekly Prayer Focus

He is encouraged that, despite deep economic pressure, scarcity, and fatigue, these leaders press on, serving in daily dependence on the Holy Spirit to grow the church in Cuba and beyond. Pachy asks that we pray for protection, strength, and perseverance for these dear servants. Pray for the young people who are discerning God’s call to mission, that they may mature in faith and confidence. Finally, pray for the church in Cuba to remain faithful, hopeful, and fruitful amid hardship.
