Weekly Prayer Focus

World Missions–International Day of Prayer for the Persecuted Church: Today we unite with Christians around the world in prayers for the persecuted church. Persecutions for these brothers and sisters range from being marginalized in the marketplace, considered outcasts by family and friends, and being unjustly imprisoned to receiving death sentences for owning a Bible. Last month several prominent Christian leaders throughout China were arrested in the biggest dragnet since 2018. Despite this cruelty, churches find creative ways to meet as their pastors send the message to “Fear not.” We are humbled by their example of gratitude for the privilege of suffering for Christ’s sake and pray that they will continue to stand firm in Christ’s strength. Pray for these dear souls to be winsome witnesses for the gospel as Jesus uses their suffering to bring many to saving faith. Pray also for protection from the evil one, timely deliverance, and wisdom for daily living.

Mission Memphis–JIFF: Juvenile Intervention & Faith-Based Follow-Up (JIFF) seeks to break the cycle of juvenile crime through Christ-centered intervention, helping at-risk youth in Memphis build new paths of promise. Through mentorship, education, and personal and professional development, JIFF equips participants to flourish free from crime. They also provide detention alternatives that let young people remain at home and in school while receiving support and guidance. Please pray for the young people who are under the care and support of their organization, as well as for the leaders, staff, and volunteers who are serving. Pray for the provision of necessary resources, both financial and human, to effectively carry out their mission.

2PC Ministry–Student Ministries: The goal of Second’s student ministry is to lead students in a growing relationship with Christ, the Church, and His work in the world. Through Scripture-based teaching, small group discipleship, community fellowship, mission trips and service projects, students in grades 6 through 12 are encouraged to daily love and follow Jesus. Pray for middle and high school students to know the love of Jesus, grow in relationship with Him, and share His love with others. Pray that the Lord would bring fruit from the fall retreats—that the Lord would form new friendships and give students a growing desire for Jesus. Please also pray for our 57 student leaders to walk faithfully with the Lord, grow in their love for the church, and boldly share the gospel with non-believing friends.
