Weekly Prayer Focus

World Missions—Paul and Jackie: Paul and Jackie moved to Central Asia in 2023. They feel blessed to be ministering to children with special needs and their families as well as planting churches. The culture where they live marginalizes the disabled, so they and their team share the good news of God's love. They are thankful to be back on the field with their happy and flexible four-month-old daughter Lucy. May God give them wisdom and discernment as they navigate ministry and parenting. Praise God for the new volunteers who joined their Young Life summer camps—may they continue to find joy in serving faithfully. Pray that new teammate Mattie feels welcomed and acclimates quickly to the language and surroundings. Finally, pray that their ministry experiences favor from the government and that Paul thrives in seminary.

Mission Memphis—A Way Out: For 31 years, A Way Out Ministries has worked to bring hope and freedom to women affected by sexual exploitation through outreach, rescues, a two-year Christ-centered residential program, and advocacy. Pray for women trapped in cycles of exploitation, addiction, and trauma—that they would experience rescue, healing, and spiritual restoration in Christ. Pray for men struggling with harmful patterns, for conviction, repentance, and the breaking of strongholds that fuel exploitation. Pray for protection and guidance over outreach teams entering challenging situations, asking God for discernment and the power of the Holy Spirit. Pray also for this month's fundraisers, for sponsors and teams to register, and for utilities to be installed at the new campus to serve more survivors.

2PC Ministry–Senior Adults Ministry: It is our privilege to care for and encourage the senior adults of our church family, cherished saints who continue to serve as pillars of faith, wisdom, and prayer. Please pray that our ministry would joyfully connect with and support all our seniors, including the many homebound members of our congregation. Pray also that we would walk faithfully with families through tender times of loss, that each funeral or memorial service would honor Christ, comfort the grieving, and proclaim the gospel with grace and hope. Finally, pray that our seniors would continue to find joy and purpose in what the Lord Jesus has for them to do as patriarchs and matriarchs of their families and this church in these rich and fruitful years of their lives.
