



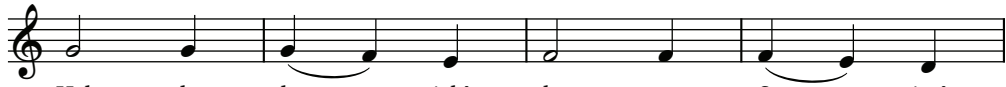

Weekly Prayer Focus

World Missions–Dan and Catherine: In August, Dan and Catherine celebrated the one-year anniversary of their return to serving in Central Asia. Dan has adapted to many dynamic teaching needs, reaching students ranging from 15 to 45 years old, and is shepherding senior ministry leaders in a sometimes-harsh ministry setting. They are asking for prayer for Dan's trip to East Asia this month to teach on the OT Poetical Books. Please pray for their church planter training in early October, that the participating teams would be equipped as they develop camaraderie and prepare to launch new churches in the next 12 months. Catherine asks for continued prayer for spiritual development in and through the Capernaum ministry as the teams grow in numbers and leadership.

Domestic Missions–A Way Out: A Way Out exists to disrupt the vicious cycle of sexual exploitation and trafficking by advocating for protections and legal justice for those trapped in the sex industry, helping restore the lives of victims, and raising awareness throughout the community. One of the primary means by which AWO accomplishes their mission is through their two-year A Way Out Victim Assistance Program. Praise God for progress on the safe house for sex trafficking survivors. Please pray for every woman who will come to the new safe house—for their salvation, healing, and safety. Praise God for a recent conversation with a dancer who opened up and shared her number for future lunch plans. Lastly, pray for all the small things needed to get the safe house ready and for new teachers, volunteers, and churches to be able to reach more women.

2PC Ministry–Music Ministry: Led by Calvin Ellis, James Ryan, Leo Davis, and Katie Hutcheson, Second's Music Ministry exists to guide the congregation in joyful worship. The ministry blends many styles, genres, instruments, and choirs in order to expand members' capacity to joyfully worship God in a variety of ways. In addition, the ministry offers choral and instrumental groups for all ages and abilities, as well as lessons through the Second Conservatory of Music. Pray for "Symphonic Harmony," a concert collaboration with the Memphis Symphony Orchestra on September 27, that many from the city will come and feel welcome. Pray for all our Music Ministry participants, from children's choirs to adult choirs, that through music and song, all would experience joyful and heart-filled worship to our God. Lastly, pray that God would be glorified and lead more people to worship Him through these efforts.
