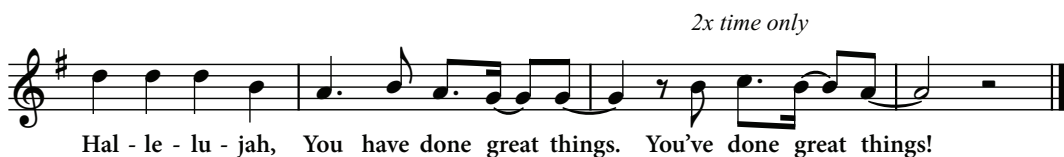



Weekly Prayer Focus

World Missions—Garth and Fiona: Garth and Fiona are thanking God for three successful summer Bible camps for children infected or otherwise affected by HIV and AIDS. They welcomed and extended the love of God to 75 teenagers and children. Pray that each of these precious hearts will remember how God loves them. Their radio broadcasts are still reaching many throughout West Africa. Listeners write of being awakened from spiritual slumber, finding light to steady and guide their days, and being encouraged. Pray that the political instability in the area does not disrupt these broadcasts, and for Garth and Fiona as they make decisions with ailing parents, struggling children, and new friends just now discovering God's love through faith in Christ.

Mission Memphis—All Saints Presbyterian Church: All Saints is a people embraced by God's love and mercy, from many backgrounds and stories, yet united as those created in His image. Though flawed, they are vessels of God's grace, seeking His will together through His Word. Pray for a family in the church threatened by a nuisance house in their Midtown neighborhood, asking God for protection, justice, and the removal of those causing harm. Pray for the church's long-term spiritual and financial health as they minister to many who are financially insecure. Ask that their simple efforts in the neighborhood bear fruit, leading people to repentance and into worship with them. Pray also for wisdom as they welcome those who wander in off the street, balancing safety with compassion.

2PC Ministry—Music Ministry: Led by Calvin Ellis, James Ryan, Leo Davis, and Katie Hutcheson, Second's Music Ministry exists to guide our church in joyful worship and to reach the city for Christ, using music as the medium. The ministry blends many styles, genres, instruments, and choirs in order to expand members' capacity to joyfully worship God in a variety of ways. In addition, the ministry offers choral and instrumental groups for all ages and abilities, as well as lessons through the Second Conservatory of Music. Pray for the Music Ministry's preparations for the upcoming Advent and Christmas season. Pray for the Second Conservatory of Music—that as students and families come into our church to receive music education, they would also see Jesus and our church's heart for the Gospel and the city of Memphis.
