Dear 2PC Family,

Can you believe it has been 6 months since our annual World Missions Conference at Second? In that half a year, we have sent out 2 members of our congregation for long-term service. We have sent 8 short-term teams with over 100 members of the congregation going. We have brought on 7 new Missionary Partners since the conference as several partners transitioned to other areas of kingdom work. We have hosted an International Worship Intern from Japan during the spring months. We have had over a dozen missionary and mission agency partners share praise reports as part of our Sunday evening worship liturgy. We have added 15 new members to our World Missions Team. And we have prayed!

We have prayed corporately in our Sunday morning services of worship. We have prayed individually through daily email or text reminders. We have prayed in parishes and Sunday School classes. And each week two groups have gathered specifically to pray for the lost world and our part in seeing it reached and saved.

Our motivation and prayer for World Missions has always been that the gospel of Jesus is just too great to keep to ourselves. Everyone deserves a chance to hear and respond to the King's grace. So, we pray in the character, values, and mindset of Jesus himself: that all who the Father would draw to him would come and that no one would snatch them out of His hand, that all would come to repentance, that no plan of the Father's would be thwarted, and that every stronghold and power assembled against the Master's plans would be torn down.

In this booklet we have updated the list of 2PC missionary partners that we support around the world. Their requests reflect the needs and concerns they face in the second half of this year and provide us all with the most urgent requests to bring before God's throne of grace. We have also added the 2PC Strategic National Impact Partners, where our church has had longer term and large-scale investments in seeing the Kingdom come on earth as it is in heaven. All these friends and covenant family members need our prayers daily!

Jesus' clear prayer requests in the Bible is to ask the Lord of the harvest to provide the laborers, for the harvest is still great, and the workers are yet few (Matthew 9:37-38). Let's ask God to teach us how to pray for them. May He fill us with His Spirit daily toward that end.

Our missionary partners are engaged in a cosmic spiritual war. The great news is that our Lord Jesus Christ has won the victory by his life, death, and resurrection! However, the battle continues until his return, and the greatest need of these Christian soldiers as they await is the prayers of the church. **Let us join the battle.**

GETTING STARTED

- Ask the Lord to teach you how to pray for our missionaries.
- Ask the Lord for whom he would have you pray, or establish a pattern to pray daily/weekly.
- Ask the Lord earnestly to send out laborers into the harvest field. (Matthew 9:37)
- Ask the Lord for the salvation of indigenous people—those who would believe and become leaders in their countries.

- Pray for their physical needs.
- Pray for their emotional needs.
- Pray for their spiritual needs (Colossians 1:9, Ephesians 1:17).
- Pray that our partners would abide with Christ, that they might bear much fruit.

- Get on a missionary's personal email list for regular updates. (Contact Missions office for help.)

KEEPING OUR HANDS OPEN

- Pray for our church.
- Pray that the Lord would call us to welcome, give, pray, and go.

Pray that the Lord would get great glory to the ends of the earth, among all people!

Emeritus Missionaries

Emeritus is an honorific designation given to someone who is retired from the public performance of a duty on account of age, infirmity, or long and faithful services. Because of the long history of World Missions involvement at Second, the faithfulness of some partners to serve for multiple decades in some very hard places and with uniquely distinctive impact, and the enduring consistency of 2PC in maintaining those partnerships, the World Missions Team has created the category of Missionary Emeritus for missionary partners who have made an exceptional contribution to Missiology, World Evangelization, and the ministry of the Second Presbyterian Church. Our first two Emeritae are Ms. Aileen Coleman and Rev. Judy Mbugua.



Aileen Coleman

"There is always some reason not to do the work of God."

Aileen Coleman first visited the Middle East as a young Australian missionary nurse in 1956. She met Dr. Eleanor Saltau, an American, in the late 1950's while working at

a Western funded tuberculosis hospital in Arroub, near Hebron. Aileen and Eleanor, sharing a love for the Bedouin people, felt called by the Lord to start a hospital in the desert of Jordan. They chose the name Annoor, which is Arabic for "Light." Many individuals and organizations told them that opening this hospital would be impossible. They sought out good friend Roy Gustafson, who encouraged them to fearlessly follow God's will. He challenged them to take a step of faith saying, "What are you doing here in my living room? Just go!" So, in 1965 she and Eleanor returned to Jordan and dedicated their hearts and lives to ministry to the Bedouin people, co-founding Annoor Sanatorium for Chest Diseases. The nomadic Bedouin tribes affectionately call her "A'Raiisa," meaning Leader or The Angel of the Desert, though she calls herself the Desert Rat!

The Sanatorium treats tuberculosis specifically and lung disease generally, providing excellent medical care in the name of Jesus. Honored by the late King Hussein of Jordan and by Queen Elizabeth of England, Aileen has been called by one dignitary "one of the greatest servants God ever put on this earth." Aileen has spent most of her life there, faithfully sharing the love of Christ into her 90's. The Lord has brought many refugees from Syria as well as those from the Israeli-Palestinian conflict who need medical care. The nation of Jordan, under the leadership of King Abdullah, has escaped the fighting and remains a sanctuary for those fleeing the conflict.

Judy Mbugua

"We will not be judged by what we began, but by how faithfully we persisted to the end."

In 1967, Judy was a new Christian, a new wife, and a young mother. Her husband did not share her faith; it took him

another 28 years before he gave his life to Christ. He would join her at church, but not accompany her to the Couples Fellowship, and the other groups for people her age were the Single Parents and Widows Groups which she did not fit in either.

So, there she was in the "most friendly church in town" yet unable to fit within any group. She felt the Lord tell her to look around and see if there were other women in her situation, and she ended up counting twenty other women. She sensed the Lord urging her to invite them to her home for fellowship. They started meeting once a month and grew to over 100 women. Within two years, they numbered over 300, spanning several denominations but all seeking to pray for the salvation of their families.

Those monthly meetings birthed what would later be named Homecare Spiritual Fellowship. In 1985, after meeting for five years in homes and various church campuses, Rev. Dr. Judy Mbugua registered Homecare Spiritual Fellowship with the government of Kenya. While 80% of Kenyans claim to be Christian, only 15% go to church and practice their faith.

The Homecare Ministry is an interdenominational fellowship of born-again Christians who are committed to praying for the salvation of whole households. Their current project is to build a new Prayer and Training Center.

Judy serves as CEO, is an ordained minister and has two honorary degrees, one in Theology. She is also a lecturer at Haggai Institute for Advanced Leadership. She has authored eight books on Christian faith and evangelizes through speaking engagements at churches. She hosts a weekly TV program, *Families under God*, and co-hosts a radio program with her son Robert.

Dave & Joyce Briley Bible Translation / U.S. Based - Indonesia

The Brileys have spent the last 48+ years creating a written language and translating the Bible for the Bauzi speaking people in Papua, Indonesia. Dave and the team are working on the translation of a shorter Old Testament. Last year, they finished three books in Bauzi (2 Kings, Ezra, and Nehemiah) and

have also been able to have 8 other OT books carried through their second comprehension check by native speakers. Currently, Dave is working with Yormi doing exegetical checks of Ecclesiastes, Ezekiel, Isaiah, and Jeremiah. That will be followed by comprehension checks with native speakers which will require Dave being physically present or via Google Meet. Dave will also need to translate these books into English for the check and approval of a consultant prior to printing.

- Pray that Dave and Joyce will remain "connected to the vine" and see the fruit of these many years of labor to translate the Bible into the Bauzi language.
- Pray for Dan and translator Yormi as they continue checking the critical interpretations for Jeremiah, Isaiah, Ezekiel, and Ecclesiastes.
- Pray for Kemus and Yulianus who must fly to the village from a government post to help them in determining whether or not the translations are accurate, acceptable, natural, and clear.



Nicole D.University Ministry and Church Teaching - Indonesia

Spouse: Feodor

God drew Nicole back to Indonesia after living in the U.S. for high school and college. Since her parents are missionaries there, she grew up familiar with the field. God made her realize how much she missed Indonesia and that

missions has always been a part of her life. She now serves on a team in which she spends most of her time on local university campuses sharing the gospel with those from the majority culture background. She leads Bible studies in local coffee shops. She also trains church members and seminary students in outreach to those of the majority religion. In the past year, she's begun a new work leading generosity workshops and helping raise funds for local urban ministries. She was married in December 2022 to Feodor, who shares her love for sharing the gospel.

- Pray for wisdom in their decisions about Feo's involvement with the work. Pray for the additional support to be raised, that this change and the new baby's arrival will necessitate.
- Pray that as more people get trained in sharing the Good News, that God will help Nicole and Feo meet people in their city who are seeking Him and open to His Word.
- Praise that the morning sickness and nausea have stopped. However, pray as Nicole is now dealing with hot flashes and headaches as she carries their baby due in November.
 Pray for their baby to continue to grow healthily and for a safe delivery.



John & Dawn
Regional Ministry Directors / U.S. Based - Global

John and Dawn have lived and served for many years in SE Asia and continue to provide leadership for roughly 35 teams and 130 staff in that part of the world. In 2019 they returned to the United States where, for various reasons, they now remain with John traveling extensively to teach and disciple new

believers, especially in several African nations. Additionally, John is leading the global Soli Deo fellowship, which focuses on keeping God "front and center" in all that is done among their agency staff. Their personally lived message is "In his heart a man plans his course, but the Lord determines his steps" (Proverbs 16:9).

- Pray for John's busy travel schedule as he visits many of the team in the four areas they serve. Ask the Lord to give him grace and stamina to deal with flight travel.
- Pray for the Lord to enable John to listen, learn, and encourage those who serve with their families in the harvest fields.
- Pray for Dawn's father who is thrilled to have deep conversations with the gentleman
 who comes to help him and looks for opportunities to continue serving the Lord until
 he is called home. Pray for Dawn as she cares for her father and handles many other
 responsibilities as she serves in her various roles.



Brian & Terri Firpo
Campus Ministry / Leadership Development - Thailand

Over thirty years ago, Brian and Terri helped launch CO Thailand where today Christian advances are numerous, but a plentiful "harvest" remains across SE Asia. While still being committed to grassroots college ministry, God is also using Brian and Terri to develop Thai CO staff and recruit laborers

for Christ to go to Thailand and the Philippines, as well as every continent in the world. Praise the Lord that this past year Covenant Church (indigenous Thai-led church) in Khon Kaen Thailand celebrated its 25th anniversary. There were also over 30 Thai students that became believers this year through the Campus Outreach ministries they help serve. Brian and Terri's vision is to see sustainable, labor-producing, indigenous, multiplying movements (SLIM2) ministries throughout Thailand and SE Asia.

- Pray for the hundreds and even thousands of students Brian and Terri and the CO teams
 will be meeting throughout Thailand over the coming months. Pray for the CO short term
 teams from Lexington, Birmingham, and DC who will be arriving to support their work.
- Pray for the Lord to lead them to more supernatural appointments on all their campuses throughout Thailand. Pray for strength to continue meeting new students and for the relationships they build to bear fruit throughout the year.
- Praise for the successful renewal of their visas to remain there legally for another year.
 Pray for their relationships with their churches throughout SE Asia.



Randy & Martha Missionary Training / U.S. Based

After serving on the field in SE Asia for nearly two decades, Randy and Martha accepted the call to serve the kingdom by supporting, training, and overseeing over 30 couples and individual field partners all over the world. They are passionate about the word, prayer, worship with the local and global

church, and engaging the Muslim world with the truth of the gospel. From their home base in the U.S., Randy spends his time developing missionary training tools, shepherding organizational leaders and families, and envisioning cross-cultural outreach strategies. Randy and Martha walk in faithfulness in seeking the Lord and cultivating healthy relationships while helping others in field positions do the same in their marriages, families, friendships, and working relationships.

Joel & Michelle J.

Church Teaching & Forming - SE Asia

God saved both Joel and Michelle before they went away to college. For Joel, it was in college that he began to realize the mission that God had saved him for. As he began to befriend international students, he learned just how

Jeff & Lynne

Business Development & Church Planting - SE Asia

Children: Evan, Jayden, Calvin, Jenna, Darre

Jeff and Lynne have labored in SE Asia for more than 16 years. Their focus has been on reaching the people of their country through prayer for the unreached, but now they are focused on gospel proclamation and partnership. This has

accounted for about 80% of Jeff's ministry time as he seeks to use social media platforms, including radio, to reach the local people. The radio station startup has been met with many government regulation obstacles and high-cost requirements. Refugees account for about 20% of the population or about eight million people. Most of these are of Muslim background. Lynne serves the refugee population in education. She uses micro learning centers to serve and reach those in the refugee community.

- Jeff and Lynn and their family have felt the burdens of a difficult year. Pray that they would be able to come to Jesus and give Him their burdens. In doing so may he transform those burdens into blessings and testimonies of His faithfulness.
- Pray for Lynne's education team who are hoping to see two more refugee learning centers started this year in addition to the one they opened earlier in the year. Pray for the Lord to raise up more laborers for the new schools.
- Pray for a great turnout for the Peace Camp and that they find local men and women of peace open to explore the scriptures. Pray their interactions with their guests will result in ongoing gospel opportunities.



Maddie Lebeter Campus Ministry - Thailand

Maddie became a Christian through Campus Outreach Memphis her freshman year in college at SE Missouri State. The summer of her junior year, she attended a CO Cross Cultural Project in Thailand and felt God's call to global missions. After graduation, she made a two-year commitment to serve

in Chiang Mai on a CO LEAD team. In 2019, she moved back to the U.S. with intentions and desires to quickly return to the Thai people, but Covid-19 and personal circumstances led to a three-year pause on those plans. She returned to Thailand this past August to serve with the CO team in Chiang Mai and minster to the Thai university students. Maddie shares that her recent Christmas in Thailand was difficult, mostly not being with family and because of her mother's death shortly before her return. She also spent time in the hospital.

- Pray for continued renewal of Maddie's heart and mind in God's Word each day, and for her personal time with the Lord to be rich and encouraging.
- Pray for the LEAD team, that Maddie directs, as they continue to develop their relationships with one another and engage Thai culture. This transition can be really hard. Pray for good time in the Word and for strong dependence on God.
- Pray for their campus planning times that God would give them vision and clarity on how
 to spend their time strategically as they continue investigating CMU. Pray for fruit from
 their engagement with students.



John M.Business Development & Church Planting / U.S. Based - SE Asia

Spouse: Carlene

In 2011, John felt the call to go back to the field as part of the EPC/WO Engage 2025 initiative. Working with an Engage 2025 missionary couple in SE Asia, they began exploring the possibility of a mariculture project. John

had a vision to use a sea cucumber business to employ local villagers and eventually plant a church. They commenced growing and selling sea cucumbers, eventually building a hatchery. A church planter joined their team, and the hatchery is making progress toward commercial levels of production. The hatchery has not scaled as quickly as John hoped, but they are encouraged by the five communities they are working with. John's team employs more than 20 nationals, both believers and nationals. Pray for discipleship and mentorship in those relationships.

- Pray for wisdom for John and his team as they navigate the next season of their project.
- Pray for a national church planting team leader who can move on site to the islands.
- Pray for continued progress in a post-pandemic world and for the team to hit their 2024 hatchery business goals.



Tyler MobleyCampus Ministry - Thailand

Tyler is one of our new missionary partners. He came to Christ through Campus Outreach Memphis in college. After conversion, the Lord opened his eyes to see the eternal realities and the needs to tell others about Jesus. Through the CO Summer project, he felt the call to bring the good news to those who have

never heard the gospel. He spent over two years serving with CO where he enjoyed working with Thai college students and learned the language. He decided to return to Thailand and will work with COServe in Chiang Mai as a full-time missionary.

- Pray that Tyler would develop in intimacy in his walk with Christ.
- Pray for his role and the growth of leadership development. Pray that he would get to know and build relationships with his new team members.
- Pray for him as he completes his support team and prepares to launch. Pray for peace
 of mind during this transition and for all the logistics involved in moving back overseas.

David & Aliece

Theological Education & Christian Counseling - East Asia

Children: Zebadiah, Zemirah, Ziera, Zetabel

David serves as Academic Dean of an unregistered, in-country seminary, helping train 60 missionaries who have been sent to unreached peoples. He works with a large church network to help them develop over thirty seminaries

to train "family church" leaders. With persecution, they can only meet in groups of fewer than fifty people. There is a great need for these small church leaders and for Sunday School material for adults and children. Last year, five hundred people attended the Reformed Theology and China Conference. Aliece's Tree of Life Counseling Center had graduates in the Biblical Counseling Master's program, and she teaches over 200 church leaders on counseling in the time of suffering.

- Pray for David as he travels frequently, teaching and providing discipleship training to local churches. Pray for his health and ability to manage a heavy workload.
- Pray for Aliece's strength and health as she expands her teaching and supervising, while
 doing counseling, offering counseling classes to leaders within local churches, and to
 home schooling their children.
- Pray for son Zebadiah as he prepares for college next summer and decides on future career paths and chooses a college. Please pray that the Lord will give Him insight on how to follow Him in his college life.



Graham & Emily

Student Ministry/RUF - Taiwan

Graham grew up in an atheist family in China. A disappointing result in the college entrance exam sent him to a less than well-known college that the Lord used to get him to meet believers and hear the gospel. He began to

trust and follow Jesus. Upon graduation he served at a local Christian school before coming to the US for seminary at Reformed Theological Seminary. He met Emily in China where she was teaching English. They married and after ordination were led into college ministry with International Students in Delaware. They are now being led back to Asia to serve with other 2PC supported partners as part of a church planting effort and to do university ministry.

As classically trained musicians, Roger and Abi Lowther felt led to use their musical talents to serve the Lord in Japan. Roger is the founder and director of Community Arts Tokyo, director of Faith & Art at Grace City Church Tokyo,

and coordinator for the MAKE Collective, a global network of artists who are working in foreign missions. Some exciting highlights from the last twelve months include discipleship efforts that have resulted in the growth of Japanese artists and the baptism of a dancer named Kanako. There was also the guiding of young people into full-time missions, the installing of a new pastor at Grace City Church, the launching of the previous Japanese pastor as a missionary to Australia, and the continued publication of Roger's books.

- Pray for the five artist interns that joined them from the United States in May. Pray for the
 Lord to bless their time there, for their presence to be an encouragement to Roger and
 Abi, and for their music and art to draw many to Him.
- Pray for their sons: Eastin and Coen and their transitions into college and high school.
 Pray for wisdom and mercy for Abi's parents and niece as they struggle with health issues.
- Praise for Yukari's three months in Memphis. Pray for her reentry into Japanese culture.
 Pray for the Lowthers continued investment in her growth and development.



Thomas & Jennifer McIntyre

Church Planters and Community Outreach - Taiwan

Thomas and Jennifer are grateful to have many opportunities to share the gospel in their current ministry and for 30 regular attendees at their park ministry in Xingang, an unreached town where they moved to plant a new

church. Thomas preaches at the new Xingang Presbyterian Church with a focus on young families that speak Mandarin. Thomas has opportunities to teach at a local university about American culture and life where he can include a section about Christianity with a clear gospel message. They hope that seekers at the Alpha course, which continues every other Saturday evening, and others to whom they have been sharing the gospel will have hearts softened to hear and respond to the good news. Evangelism continues to be their major focus. Praise the Lord that the Sanhe Gospel church in Zhongpu, started by Thomas and Jennifer, continues to grow and effectively share the gospel!

- Pray for their last term in Taiwan to be fruitful and impactful for the Kingdom. They will
 move back to the U.S. in 2025. Please pray for them to finish strong and for this huge
 upcoming transition for their family.
- Thomas and Jennifer have been pursuing the adoption of a Taiwanese girl for two years now. Pray that their family gets approved to adopt the girl they call "LQ", who is in second grade, then begin the dossier and court process which can take 12-15 months.
- Pray for their short Sabbatical this summer to address some medical issues.



Tim & Huilan Leadership Training - Taiwan

Tim and Huilan moved back to East Asia in 2010 to start a seminary in their city. Tim recruited teachers who helped create ordination exams for local house church pastors. Last year, they started a new initiative, the Center for House

Church Theology, where Tim serves as a fellow. Three missionary families moved to different cities in their region in 2023 which brings the total units in the region to 11, despite increasing religious persecution. They rejoice that one pastor, held in prison for a year, has been released and is now with his wife and family. Also, three new Parakaleo groups are starting (online and in person), to encourage spiritual growth for women. The political climate is still stifling, but they are hopeful as they see increased openness in people's hearts. They are also glad that the book Faithful Disobedience, featuring the writings of many house church leaders, has been published to teach and inspire churches.

- Pray for Christ's College Taipei, China Reformed Theological Seminary, and the Christian Hakka Seminary. Pray for the Diaspora Ministry Academy, a school they hope to open in Korea for refugee and migrant worker children.
- Pray for the Lord to bring blessings out of the disaster for the families of earthquake victims and those who were injured in the April earthquake in Taiwan.
- Pray for their children: Ethan, Micah, and Ciana in their spiritual journey. May the Lord move in their hearts and draw them closer to Him



David & Lisa Leadership Training & Midwifery - East Asia

Children: Bella (Deji) - Foster Child

David and Lisa labor among the mountain people of Central Asia utilizing their training and professional skills. Their ministry focuses on consulting, training, counseling, one-on-one discipleship, and evangelism. They also

train and equip some leaders of the local church. They face significant travel restrictions linked to their fostering of Bella, yet Dave and Lisa creatively persevere. They are using DBS (Discovery Bible Study) with locals and expats in their city. Many of their students (representing at least 30 different nations) participated in a DBS small group and learned how to lead one with friends and family back home. Praise the Lord for the baptisms of mountainous people, locals, and expats last year. Dave and Lisa trained those who shared, led people to the Lord, and did the baptisms.

largest unreached people group in the world. Outreach activities include home parties, sports outings, English classes, and Bible studies all focused on a non-Christian audience with outcomes both joyful and occasionally dark. A recent survey showed that 35% of Japanese young people felt hopeless about their futures. They share poignant stories of Christ's work in one-on-one conversations such as friendship inquiries by the wife of a Buddhist priest, "T"s excitement over the "community of God", "M"s study of Luke and questions about "who Jesus really was", "R"s blossoming understanding of God's unconditional love, and "K"s inquiry about "How do I become a Christian?"

- Pray for wisdom and direction as Jeff and Katie navigate moving their family to a new area of town, closer to their church and the university where they do most of their ministry.
- Pray for their church, Grace Harbor Church, where Jeff will begin a new assignment. Pray for the Lord to draw Jeff and Katie closer to him during this time.

She teaches and trains its leaders and volunteers while networking to multiply their work. Several moms have come to faith and now bring their children to Bible studies and church. Last year, both helped launch the Rock, a new church plant in their city. Ruslan has been preaching, training, and organizing its growing leadership with much time and energy provided by Zhanna.

She is thankful for the care with which the 2PC family has surrounded her!

Sameh & Samah National Partners - Middle East

Sameh and Samah are graduates of Arab Baptist Theological Seminary. Sameh is Christian background Egyptian while Samah (the wife) is Muslim background Egyptian. Egyptian religion laws don't allow their marriage nor

recognize Sameh's fatherhood of their son. In 2017, they moved to Brazil where Selim was born and received citizenship which led to Sameh and Samah receiving citizenship as well. Now they are "legal" and thus able to return to the Middle East where they are serving in discipleship ministry at Resurrection Church, leading "spiritual tribes." Sameh is leading the youth ministry, and Samah serves the online ministry for the church, which mirrors the physical church in everything it offers, and translation. They connect and walk beside local believers at a Bedouin church on the border. They have empowered local leaders to multiply house churches and hope to start meetings for women, youth, and children.

- Pray for Sameh who leads the youth and young adult's ministry among the refugees in their church. Pray for the summer camp and prayer conference.
- Pray for their vision to grow together with intimacy around the Word of God. Pray for
 their church events to provide an opportunity for the youth and young adults to be drawn

Theological Education - Middle East

At 20 years old, M. fled his Muslim majority native country and became a refugee in Greece. He visited a church where he heard the gospel for the first time. He met a group of short-term missionaries from Canada and, through them, became a believer. When he started attending Bible studies, he discovered the teachers really didn't know their Bibles that well, so he joined the Athens Intensive Ministry School. In Athens he spent two years as a pastor, then went to Canada to work with a mission serving other refugees. It was there he met Sarah who had just returned from serving overseas. They married, and in 2011 left for a Middle Eastern country where they started a Bible training institute to help educate the underground church in the region. They have seen over 50 graduates, some of whom returned to their home countries to plant churches.

- Pray for their in-person conferences that gather leaders and families for more intense
 training, and for the fellowships connected to their institute through graduates and current
 students, enabling their programming to be more flexible and have a broader reach.
- They continue to mentor students through online meetings, phone calls, email, and text. Pray for these students as they meet weekly online to have lessons and discussion to become actively engaged in ministry.
- Pray for M. and Sarah's lives to point to the one who saves and for their friends to continue asking questions about their faith, ultimately coming to know the one true God.



Robby & Joyce GROW Project Executive Directors / U.S. Based - Lebanon

Robby and Joyce lead the Philemon Project in Lebanon, which recently celebrated their 10th anniversary of the first GROW center. GROW is a Christian preschool that serves the most at-risk children in Beirut. They fight food insecurity by providing two meals and two snacks a day, gender

discrimination by empowering their all-female staff, and child labor and trafficking by educating and caring for these at-risk children. It is most often the only place these families encounter the gospel and the love of God. They hope to open GROW2 in early summer 2024 in another area of Beirut and are close to that goal. The building will also host a church plant they are involved with on the top floor. Their success has led them to dream of a third center sometime in the future to multiply the gospel impact of the center on the families of Beirut.

- Pray for peace in the Middle East and that war does not spread to Lebanon.
- Pray that the work on GROW2 would be completed on time and that God would provide the staff needed to open GROW2 this fall.
- Pray for the future children who will attend GROW2, and their families, that God will
 prepare their hearts to hear of His love and to receive it by faith and with joy.



CierraRefugee Ministry - Middle East

Cierra is a member of Second's daughter church, The Avenue, and joined the Engage 2025 team in the Middle East this past summer. Her focus has been language learning and cultural acquisition as she engages with the local people. She has enjoyed getting to know her team and entering life and

Administrator & Nurse - Annoor Sanatorium

Herb and Heather work at Annoor Sanatorium treating tuberculosis among the Bedouin people. However, the current reality is that less than half of the patients are Jordanian, and Bedouins are only a percentage of that number. They increasingly serve patients from Yemen to Sudan and all over the Middle

East. Although there is a much smaller percentage of Bedouins in their clinic, they have a team in Ras An Naqab and a mobile dental unit that serves the isolated Bedouin communities. After pursuing approval of new residence permits for a very long time, Annoor was granted permits for 19 volunteers. These permits were the first granted since 2021. The remaining document to provide medical and other services has been sent to the Prime Minister's office for implementation.

- Pray for the work of the Sanatorium amidst the changing face of TB in Jordan with an
 increasing number of non-pulmonary cases. Many of these cases are in Asian workers
 who have come to Jordan to work in the factories.
- Pray for the staff as they are challenged in trying to communicate the Gospel across these language barriers.
- Pray for the two men who most likely contracted TB in prison. They face multiple
 challenges in lifestyle and relationships with their families. Pray they will truly repent of
 their past and trust Jesus to make all things new in their hearts and circumstances.



Mike & Stephanie Teacher & ITEN Specialists - U.S. Based

Mike and Stephanie served as missionaries and educators in the Muslim world for many years and have a passion for training Arabic speaking believers. Mike, who is fluent in Arabic and is a gifted teacher, leads the EPC World Outreach's International Theological Educational Network (ITEN). The ITEN

is having an amazing impact and has great relationships with its national partners. Of special note to 2PC, Dan Burns works with Mike on this network. Mike is also a highly regarded author and is actively working on translating and publishing his recent book on Peter's spiritual formation into Arabic. Mike is encouraged by the large number of Spanish speakers training for missional involvement through the ITEN ministry at the Central America Theological Seminary. Mike is grateful for Second's long years of partnership and support.

- Pray for Mike's travel to Sierra Leone for a graduation of the ITEN cohort who will now
 take on the entire training of their people. Pray for Mike and others as they remain in

They were even able to facilitate a Bible study with a local family of new believers! They continue to partner with their host church and consistently minister to Muslimbackground refugees, many from Syria. One ongoing ministry equips Syrian women with crochet skills and provides yarn to make blankets for other refugees living in areas that are very cold.

Over the past year, unrest in the region has been difficult for local people, as well as their team. In 2007, Kyle and Claudia returned to Buenos Aires and La Mision Church, where Kyle had served for a period after college. Currently, the Zimmermans serve at La Mision's Palermo campus, a suburban area, where they are

both involved in teaching. Kyle is an industrial engineer and is using his skills to teach carpentry and woodworking to young men living in shanty towns. These young men come to learn a trade, but many have said they stay to hear the gospel lessons Kyle shares with them. The economy is expected to reach 140% inflation this year. Their church is stepping in to help fill the hunger gap by serving 200 meals each Saturday. Through the carpentry classes, Kyle has been able to provide stipends to two advanced students, which has helped their family during financial need as they refine their carpentry skills while producing several products to sell locally and stateside.

- Pray that God would continue to bless Kyle's ministry, both as an elder at La Mision and
 as a carpentry teacher, and that he might reflect Christ's love to those around him. Pray
 for Claudia as she shepherds the women and for their continued spiritual growth.
- Pray for their small groups, especially the Flores group that has struggled with finances and health issues. Pray for the economic situation in Argentina.
- Pray for their three children, that God would guide and direct Isaiah at Covenant, Sarah
 as she starts at Cedarville, and for Abby as she becomes an only child at home and
 begins the application process for college.

Strategic National Impact Partners

Over the decades, Second Presbyterian Church has established unique relationships with non-American led churches or missions that have scaled into significant places of ministry fruitfulness. The World Missions Team, on behalf of the congregation, focuses significant resources on these partners because these locations are marked by three common characteristics.

NATIONALLY LED

Shown through indigenous leadership and measurable local resource contributions in addition to what we provide

SCALABLE

The original ministry work can/is/has multiply(ing, ied) into increasingly numerous and spread-out spheres of need, service, and transformation.

CHURCH DIRECTED

Even when our primary partner isn't a specific church, the partner we collaborate with is receiving leadership from local churches, starting new churches, and/or strengthening existing churches.



YL Central Asia

This ministry, that primarily focuses on jr. high and sr. high school students, has grown from a single club out of a local church planted by a 2PC member. It is now a multi-country ministry with dozens of indigenous staff led by Central Asian directors. YLCA also works with special needs students and parents of students and has planted churches where there weren't churches to oversee YL clubs that had formed.



Indonesia Partnership

A collaborative network of non-Indonesian churches, of which 2PC is a member, supports an Indonesian network of churches and church planters that are reaching out to people from the majority culture/religion with clear explanations of the gospel and discipling in what following Christ means.



China Partnership

A collaborative network of non-Chinese churches, of which 2PC is a member, supports a Chinese network of churches and church planters strengthening existing churches, forming new churches from the response to evangelistic efforts, and beginning to help the global Chinese diaspora population know Jesus in the places they have landed around the world.



The Evangelical Churches of Greece

Through our relationship with the First Evangelical Church of Athens, planted over 150 years ago in the shadow of the Acropolis, we have been honored to join them in seeing multiple churches planted across that city. The lessons learned have been passed along to others across western Europe through City-to-City Europe. Now the pastors of Athens are taking these lessons into the Balkan region of Eastern Europe.



La Mision

Our church's relationship with the Presbyterian church in Argentina goes back over 25 years. Central to that work is our partnership with La Mision Church. Planted by pastor Marcelo Robles, it has grown to multiple campuses that are preparing to become individual particularized churches themselves. From these churches we share projects of evangelism, discipleship, service, mercy, and training across Buenos Aires and into other South American nations.



Kachhwa Christian Hospital

For over 20 years, Raju and Catherine Abraham ran this hospital in rural India, added an intensive care unit, taught children at an attached Christian school, trained church planters and pastors, and drew people into a church at the center of the compound. Now retired, the Abrahams turned over the work to Shankar and Blodwyn Ramachandran, who worked and served with Raju for many of those years. As with a medical IV, they seek to balance the saline (salt) and sucrose (sweet) of the gospel message in their work among a population that has limited opportunities to get help from any source.



World Relief Malawi

For 80 years, World Relief has sought to alleviate poverty through local church alliances in the poorest places on earth. For over 20 years, 2PC has been partnering with WR in Malawi to see suffering reduced, including and especially eternal suffering. We have recently wrapped up 15 years of work in Ntchisi, one area of Malawi, and are opening a new region that has never had this type of work done.



Campus Outreach SERVE

2PC has launched multiple CO regions in the USA from our hub in Memphis. We've seen multiplication of the movement in Indianapolis, Lexington, Peoria, St. Louis, and Baton Rouge. Through CO SERVE, we send alumni and staff to strengthen and launch international locations with special partnerships in Thailand, Zambia, Birmingham UK, South Africa, and Athens.
