Paul's Prayer List Colossians 1:9-12 April 21, 2024

And so, from the day we heard, we have not ceased to pray for you... - Colossians 1:9

I. A PRAYER WITHOUT CEASING

- Since the time Paul (and his companions) heard of the church in Colossae, they have been praying for them (Vs. 9; Eph. 1:15-22).
- · Here is Paul's prayer list:
 - 1. That the Colossians might be filled with knowledge of God's will (combined with spiritual wisdom and understanding, that they may walk in a manner worthy of the Lord).
 - 2. That they will bear fruit in their works and increase in knowledge.
 - 3. They will grow strong in the power of God leading to joy, endurance, and patience.
 - 4. He gives thanks to God for the Colossians, and for all that God has done through Christ on their behalf.

II. PUTTING PRAYER TO ACTION

- Paul's prayer is ultimately good words said before a good God unless those prayers become action (James 1:22-25).
- Paul's prayer + action = Christian maturity (Eph. 4:11-16).
- Strive to put this laundry list of Christian traits to action in your life. All of them build upon each other. All are foundational to a long obedience in the same direction.

KNOW: The Apostle Paul was a praying apostle. He did not simply talk about the gospel. He prayed that people would receive it and for those who had received it.

DO: Put Paul's prayer to work in your life. Pray accordingly.
