Christ Over All A study in Colossians

Deliverance Colossians 1:13-14 April 28, 2024

He has delivered us from the domain of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom of his beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins. - Colossians 1:13-14

I. A NEW EXODUS

- As God delivered his people out of Egypt and into the Promised Land, so Jesus redeems his people from slavery in a dark land to a kingdom of light (Vs. 13; Ex. 6:6-8).
- The language of "redemption" and "darkness" is also part of the biblical narrative of salvation (Hosea 13:14; Micah 4:10; Isa. 41:14; 42:6-8, 16; 43:1, 14; 44:22-23).
- In our salvation, we transfer allegiances from one kingdom to the next. Spiritual realities are at work here. There are two kingdoms in this universe, a kingdom of darkness and a kingdom of light (Col. 1:12; Luke 22:52).
- Paul speaks here of a great transfer. Believers were set in darkness, now we are in "the kingdom of his beloved Son." Jesus is the Messiah now sitting on the throne of his father David (2 Sam. 7:8-17; Eph. 2:1-10; Col. 1:13).

II. RANSOMED, FORGIVEN, ADOPTED

- There may be no sentence more beautiful in all the Bible than "In whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins" (Eph. 1:7-14).
- Paul has given us a shorthand version of justification. In one great act of grace, God redeems us, frees us of our guilt, and adopts us into his family (Rom. 8:12-17; Titus 2:11-14).
- We are not what we once were—we are not yet what we will be (1 John 3:1-3).

KNOW: God has not simply delivered us from a sad life to a happy life. He has delivered us, literally, from the darkness. In addition to this great act, he has transferred us into the kingdom of his much loved Son. In him, and him alone, lies redemption and the forgiveness of sins.

DO: Find redemption and forgiveness in Jesus. Step out of darkness and into light.
