Christ Over All A study in Colossians

Preeminent Over All Colossians 1:18 May 12, 2024

And he is the head of the body, the church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in everything he might be preeminent. - Colossians 1:18

I. THE BODY, THE CHURCH

- The universal church is the body of the Lord Jesus Christ. He is its head. He is its source (1 Cor. 12:27; Eph. 5:23; Heb. 13:3; 1 Tim. 3:14-16).
- Paul focuses here on Christ himself. He emphasizes the church's organic and dependent relation to Jesus as the ruler and leader of his body (Eph. 1:22-23; 1 Peter 2:2-8).

II. FIRSTBORN OVER THE NEW CREATION

- Jesus is the beginning of creation, the Creator. He is also firstborn over the new creation. The life of the church is the life of the new creation (John 14:19; Rom. 8:29; 1 Cor. 15:20-26).
- As Creator, Jesus is Lord over creation by right. As the risen Savior, he is Lord in action, deed and power (Rom. 1:3-4).

III. CHRIST OVER ALL

• Jesus is preeminent over all things; everything; there are no exceptions. Without him nothing was made. Without him, nothing will be made alive (Acts 4:8-12).

KNOW: A new creation begins in Jesus Christ. He is the beginning and the firstborn from the dead. He is the preeminent one.

DO: Know and follow Jesus as he is, not how we think he might be. He is the exalted one.
