2026 Fasting, Prayer, & Devotional Bible Reading Plans

We are setting apart twenty-one days at the beginning of January 2026 to seek the Lord for ourselves, our families, church, cities, and government. Our expectation is that God will speak to us and move powerfully in our lives during and after this specific time of prayer, fasting and personal devotion. We envision this fasting, Bible reading, and prayer movement, much like a seed being planted into the ground of our lives that God will water and cause to grow as the year of 2026 unfolds. We encourage you to prepare your heart for how God will use this in your life. You may have questions about fasting so please read through the rest of this booklet for more information. You will also read about all of the exciting opportunities of prayer, reading and devotional studies we will share during the month of January 2026.

21-Day Food Fast

January 4-25 (12noon to 12noon)

Daniel Fast (vegetables, fruit, water, black coffee, 100% fruit juice, unsweetened tea). You can also do a plan that has no bread, sweets, treats or sugary drinks. Read more information about fasting in this packet.

21-Day Media Fast

January 4 – 25

Media Fast (no TV, social media, games, movies, YouTube videos, Netflix, Hulu, Prime, Disney Plus, etc.) You can still use your phone for texting, calling, Bible reading, and RightNow Media for our devotional studies, no worries there. You CAN watch Christian TV, preachers/teachers, the news (to stay abreast of what's happening in the world), but limit it to only those types of media. READ MORE BELOW.

21 Day Financial Fast

January 4 - 25

The purpose of the fast is to eliminate spending on absolutely everything that is not essential. For three weeks you must refrain from buying anything that is not a necessity. Necessities are: Food, medicine, monthly bills, mortgage/rent.

Refrain from going to the mall or retail stores to shop for clothes, shoes, jewelry, nonessential household items, or other stuff that creates a drag on your financial life (and clutters your home). No restaurant meals — fast food or otherwise. This includes buying breakfast or lunch at work. You can't stop for coffee. Make it at home instead. During the fast, forget going out to the movies and concerts. Fill that time with prayer, Bible reading, listening to Christian teaching, etc.



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H.E.A.R. Journal Method

A H.E.A.R. Journal is a simple way to help you read the Bible with the intention of Applying it.

By asking four simple questions, you can understand and apply any passage. In addition, journaling is a great discipline because it helps you retain three times more of what you read.

Every week, each will share a H.E.A.R. Journal and discuss what we have heard from God's Word. There is not a set amount of H.E.A.R. Journals that you must do each week, but the goal with this discipline, as with all of the others, is to improve as time goes on. Consider how often you currently journal and do "+1" of that. So, if you have

never journaled, just try to do a couple a week. If you journal occasionally, try to do three times a week. The hope is that as you get more comfortable with this discipline and experience its benefit, you will want to increase this number throughout the year.

As you read through your reading plan each week, create a H.E.A.R. Journal by using these four questions.

H (HIGHLIGHT)

What is a verse(s) that stood out to you in your reading?

E (EXPLAIN)

What is the author's intended meaning in the context of the passage?

A (APPLY)

What is the principle to live by today?

R (RESPOND)

How will I respond to the application in my relationships and/or situations this week?

Personal Devotion

Just like prayer and fasting, reading your Bible is about connecting to God in a more powerful way. It is not about duty but about relationship. When we engage God through reading His Word, we engage the very presence of God. His Word is living and active! As we read our Bible, we are drawing closer to God and positioning ourselves to hear from Him in particular ways.

Once again, as with prayer, choose the time and the place where you are going to read your Bible and devotional every day, and come prepared to hear what He wants to tell you.

Here are three quick things we'd like to share with you about how to get the most out of your devotional time with God.

1. READ CONSISTENTLY

It is better to read a little every day than to ty and knock out two hours of Bible reading or devotions in one sitting. It is so important to digest the Word in absorbable chunks. Don't bite off more than you can chew, and certainly don't compare your "performance" with that of others. If you miss a few days, pick up at the next reading, but stay with it and don't give up. The key is to keep this simple and make it sustainable.

2. READ PRAYERFULLY

Talk to God as you're reading. Don't rush through. If you come across something you don't understand, pause for a moment and ask God about it. Reading prayerfully is making space and time to talk to God and giving Him time and space to talk to you. Taking time to meditate on God's Word is just as important as reading it.

3. READ EXPECTANTLY

You are about to partake of the bread of life, so foster an attitude of expectancy. Believe that God is going to speak to you through His Word. With meditation on the ideas and thoughts recorded in your journal, be prepared to do something with what He shows you. A great, simple way to journal your devotionals is to use the SOAP method.

4. SOAP METHOD

Scripture Observation Application Prayer

The **SOAP** method is used like this:

S is for Scripture. Read prayerfully. Take notice of which Scripture(s) catches your attention and mark it in your Bible. When you're done, reread the verse(s) you marked and look for one that particularly speaks to you. Write it in your journal.

O if for Observation. Focusing on that Scripture, tune in and listen to what God is saying to you though His Word. What is it about this Scripture that specifically stands out? What does God want to reveal to you or teach you? Ask the Holy Spirit to be your guide and show you what God is saying.

A is for Application. Think of how this verse(s) applies to your life right now. Perhaps it is instruction, encouragement, revelation of a new promise, or correction for a particular area of your life. Use your journal to write how this Scripture applies to you today.

P is for Prayer. Wrap up your SOAP time in prayer. Talk to God about what you've just read. This can be as simple as thanking Him for revealing a truth from the Scripture, or it may be asking Him for greater insight or wisdom as to how it applies to your life. Remember, prayer is all about relationship. It's a two-way conversation, so be sure to listen to what God has to say.

That's it ... SOAP!!! It's as simple or deep as you want it to be. If you want to go deeper in your study here are additional tips.

- > Reread the daily passage in a different Bible translation or paraphrase
- Utilize online resources, such as those available from crosswalk.com, youversion.com or Biblestudytools.com
- > Utilize a commentary, such as those by Matthew Henry or online at BibleGateway.com
- Cross-reference your daily reading using the footnotes in your study Bible

CHURCH CORPORATE 21-DAY FAST JANUARY 4 - 25

"...But the days will come when the bridegroom will be taken away from them, and then they will fast."

Matthew 9:15b NKJV

WHAT IS A FAST?

Fasting is when someone or a group of people abstain from food (fully or partially) for a specific period of time in order to seek God through prayer. Many people in the Bible practiced fasting as a spiritual discipline or in response to something specific. In the Old Testament, Israel was required by God to fast collectively at least once a year on the Day of Atonement as well as other occasions. In the New Testament we have records of the early church fasting and praying together for specific reasons and reliable church history tells us that the early church practiced fasting twice a week, usually on Wednesday and Friday.

WHY DO WE FAST?

Knowing what a fast is doesn't necessarily mean we understand its purpose. We can find many good Scriptural reasons for fasting and below you will find a short list of some of these reasons. It's important to remember that we not only fast and pray for ourselves, but also for those around us.

- 1. To humble ourselves to God (repentance) Psalm 35:13, 1 Samuel 7:6, Ezra 9
- 2. To come closer to God James 4:8
- 3. To understand God's Word (revelation) Ephesians 1:17-22
- 4. To know God's will or direction Acts 13:1-2
- 5. To seek healing/deliverance Isaiah 58, Matthew 17:21
- 6. To seek God's intervention 2 Samuel 12:16-23, 2 Chronicles 20:3
- 7. To intercede for others Daniel 9:3

DIFFERENT TYPES OF FASTS

There are many different ways to do a fast. The most important part of fasting is the time we spend with God in prayer. If we deny ourselves food and do not pray then we will accomplish nothing. The following types of fasts are simply references to what we can do as we seek the Lord in prayer.

1. Full Fast

A full fast is where you go completely without food for a specific amount of time. There are at least four references in the Bible where people fasted food and water; however, we are only referencing food as a full fast for obvious reasons. If you choose to do a full fast then we recommend you consult with others prior to doing so, especially if you take any kinds of medication.

2. Partial Fast

A partial fast is to simply go without a meal or two during the day of your fast. For example, you could fast from dinner or lunch and spend an extended amount of time in prayer in place of that meal. There are no rules to this kind of fasting but you should decide beforehand what you will do and stick to it as with all fasts.

3. Daniel Fast

This kind of fast comes from Daniel chapter 10, where Daniel had a terrifying vision that caused him to abstain from all pleasant food and drink. If you choose to do this kind of fast then essentially you will be abstaining from all "meats, sweets, and treats." Most people stick to fruits, vegetables and nuts or similar kinds of protein. There are many resources online that could provide healthy options with this fast.

4. Media Fast/Soul Fast (Daniel 6:18)

Sometimes we are unable to participate in abstaining from food for various health reasons, however, this does not mean we cannot fast and pray. There are times we need to refocus certain areas of our lives that are out of balance. For example, you might choose to stop using social media or watching television for the duration of the fast and then carefully bring that element back into your life in healthy doses at the conclusion of the fast. We strongly encourage you to replace forms of entertainment (TV, movies, internet surfing, social media) with prayer and intentional time with family. God often uses this kind of fast to quiet the noise in our life and increase our ability to hear His voice.

PRACTICAL POINTS OF FASTING

- 1. Plan your fast what kind of fast? How long? Write your plan out! We are corporately fasting as a church family (all together) for 21 days from January 5 26, 2025 from 12noon to 12noon.
- 2. Be specific with your fasting know why you're fasting and what you're praying for. Write down your personal prayer requests as well as pray over the corporate church prayer list.
- 3. Plan your prayer time for each day when will you pray? Plan it out. Mark your location and time that you will pray each day at your home, on your job, and at the church. Being intentional helps you accomplish your goal.
- 4. **Journal your fast God will speak to you, but it may mean more at another time**. Write about your fast experience, what you heard from God, how you felt each day and what you heard Him say. If you don't journal it on paper, put it in your phone!
- 5. **Drink lots of water we get most of our water from food, so double up on your water.** The great thing about increasing your water intake during the fast, is the amazing health benefit you'll get from the fast. God is amazing in how He asks us to fast and turns that sacrifice into a benefit for us at the end!
- 6. **Invite Accountability it's good to share what you're doing with a trusted friend.**The exciting thing about our church wide prayer and fasting period, is knowing that we are all doing it together. There is accountability and comradery within our church as we fast and pray together.

Media Fast For 2026

That's right: no TV, social media, games, movies, YouTube videos, Netflix, Hulu, Prime, Disney Plus, etc. You can still use your phone for texting and calling, no worries there. You CAN watch Christian TV, preachers, the news (to stay abreast of what's happening in the world), but limit it to only those types of media. Try watching Christian based shows and teaching (The Chosen, Right Now Media Videos and Teaching, etc.)

When the thought of a media fast comes to mind, I'm sure you wanted to immediately blow it off. "That's way too hard and unrealistic,". It does seem a little unrealistic considering the amount of time we spend doing media related things.



According to Hacker Noon, the average person spends over 4 hours a day on their phone for social media purposes. That's 86 hours a month! Furthermore, Statista states the average U.S. consumer spends 3.6 hours watching TV a day. Another study by MediaKix shows that over the average lifetime, most will spend 7 years and 8 months watching TV and 5 years and 4 months on Social Media. I don't know about you, but those statistics alone reveal a global obsession with media.

The truth is, doing a media fast isn't unrealistic or impossible, it's just extremely *inconvenient* for most of us. But can we offer you a bit of encouragement that was given to us? Many times, we do sincerely desire to hear God, know His voice, and get in tune with His heart. While our desire may be authentic and real, are we willing to tune out the noise of our loudest competitor in order to tune in to what God is doing and speaking?

Twenty-one days. Give this thing 21 days. This is a common amount of time for any type of fasting. It's a long enough period of time to *begin* developing a healthy habit and honestly, it goes pretty fast! Starting this fast on January 5th and run through January 26th, mark out the FULL 21 days on your calendar, which means starting at 12noon of day 1 and ending at 12noon of day 22.

Because media is such a habitual part of our lives, some people find it helpful to completely delete the apps they frequently use to make it less of a temptation. I've also heard of people putting signs on their TV saying, "Don't watch me!" so they remember not to turn it on. Whatever will help you, do it! Also, tell a friend what you're doing and have them keep you accountable. Or, challenge them to do it with you!

Exceptions

I realize that some people have to use social media for their jobs. This is not a big deal, just get your posting and scheduling done and try your best not to mindlessly scroll for entertainment's sake. However, do still check emails on the fast.

Also consider just listening to Christian music for the 21 days. Remember the heart of "tuning out" is to "tune in".

Ideas of What to Do Instead of Media

You'll be amazed at how much time you normally spend on media when it's no longer an option! Here are some ideas of things to do while you are media-less:

- Get a few books you've been wanting to read
- Board games-play them!
- Read your Bible or start a new Bible study
- Make a 21 Day prayer journal and write in it when you feel like you want to grab your phone or watch TV
- Cook for fun!...but stick to the Daniel Fast if you're participating.
- Take a walk/ walk your dog.
- Create things! (That's right-without Pinterest.)
- Call your friend/relative you haven't talked to in awhile
- Exercise!
- Clean and organize cluttered spaces that drive you bonkers
- Write an encouraging note to a friend
- Invite friends over to hang out/have dinner/ play a game

Establish a Clear Vision

These next 21 days will be **hard**– but most good things are. As you prepare to start your media fast, have a clear vision of what you want to learn and pursue in these next 21 days. Some examples could be, "In these 21 days, I want to...

- Grow closer to God and focus on hearing Him
- Spend more quality time with my husband, kids and/or friends
- Learn how to be authentically creative without media-inspiration
- Develop new habits on how to spend my free time wisely
- Make space to pray and prepare for the New Year

Whatever your vision, you can count on this: you will learn so much. Anticipate it! And most importantly remember the heart of fasting.

Remember Jesus words from Matthew 6:16-18,

"Whenever you fast, do not put on a gloomy face as the hypocrites do, for they neglect their appearance so that they will be noticed by men when they are fasting. Truly I say to you, they have their reward in full. But you, when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face so that your fasting will not be noticed by men, but by your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees what is done in secret will reward you."

PRAYER

As you prepare for the 31 days of fasting and prayer it can be tempting to start thinking of a laundry list of prayers you'd love to see answered. We really want to encourage you to keep this simple. Think about the top two or three things most pressing on your heart and zone in on those with God. Write them down in the space provided below, and be open to hearing what God wants to show you in those areas. The breakthroughs, miracles, and answers to your prayers will be by-products of drawing closer to Jesus.

When praying, make your primary goal to know Jesus more and experience Him. Pray prayers of total surrender, and aim to glorify God with your life. Focus first on what's right about Him, such as His goodness and His greatness, and see everything else through that filter.

Most simply, make time to pray daily. Don't overcomplicate this! Just talk to God. Have that place and time where you can seek Him every day. If you don't plan to pray, you won't. If you find it a challenge to disconnect from the busyness of your day, engaging in worship music is a great way to prepare your heart for prayer.

God will give you endurance and persistence to stand the testing as our gaze is on Him. Pray that the trials will help us to grow in faith and develop in perseverance. Fresh Inspiration and Vision - Habakkuk 2:3 For the revelation awaits an appointed time; it speaks of the end and will not prove false. Though it linger, wait for it; it will certainly come and will not delay. Declare that lost vision and purpose be restored in Jesus Name. Declare we see our God's given destiny with a renewed mindset and become motivated to accomplish everything God has called us to do in Jesus Name.

Another Level of Growth - Ephesians 4:13-14 Until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ. Then we will no longer be infants, tossed back and forth by the waves, and blown here and there by every wind of teaching and by the cunning and craftiness of men in their deceitful scheming. We declare that we grow and go to another level in the spirit. We decree another level of promotion come upon us to elevate us to new places of influence and leadership. We declare another level of growth develops and comes into full fruition in Jesus Name.

Watch and Pray - Matthew 26:41 Watch and pray so that you will not fall into temptation. The spirit is willing, but the body is weak. "That He would grant you, according to the riches of His glory, to be strengthened with power through His Spirit in the inner man, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith; and that you, being rooted and grounded in love, may be able to comprehend with all the saints what is the breadth and length and height and depth, and to know the love of Christ which surpasses knowledge, that you may be filled up to all the fullness of God." (Ephesians 3:16-19)

- 20. Pray that the body of Christ would faithfully show love to a hurting world in His Name. "Let all that you do be done in love." (1 Corinthians 16:14). "By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." (John 13:35)
- 21. Pray for God's provision and that the church would be faithful to give generously. "And my God will supply every need of yours according to his riches in glory in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 4:19). "In all things I have shown you that by working hard in this way we must help the weak and remember the words of the Lord Jesus, how he himself said, 'It is more blessed to give than to receive." (Acts 20:35
- 22. Pray that the church would be faithful to go into all the world and share the gospel of Christ. "He said to them, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation." (Mark 16:15)
- 23. Pray that God would wake up the church and stir us to action. "Praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints," (Ephesians 6:18)
- 24. Pray that Cornerstone will have a positive testimony in the community. Especially in this culture of thinly-veiled distaste towards all aspects of Christian faith, a clean testimony in the community is important. Be known for compassion, love, grace, and standing on the truth of God's Word no matter the protests and criticism. John 3:21; 1 John 4:7, 19.
- 25. Pray for volunteers. Pray that there will be enough volunteers to cover all the ministries of the church. Pray that volunteers will not be stretched thin and burned out on serving, but will maintain a balance between serving and being served. Acts 6:3-7
- 26. Pray for those who lead in musical worship. Pray especially that their preparation time will be a time of worship for them personally as they seek the leading of the Holy Spirit, and that the worship service will not be a 'show,' but will be an offering of praise. Psalm 150
- 27. Pray for a spirit of unity in the church. Too many churches are divided over personalities, style of worship, minor issues of personal preference, and other non-Biblical concerns. Pray that this spirit of division will not pervade your church, but that yours will be a church known for its peace and unity. Philippians 4:2-3
- 28. Pray for a spirit of understanding. The church is not a place for perfect people. Because of that mistakes will be made and people's feelings will get hurt. Pray that these universal problems of humanity will not cause members of the church to look down on some while elevating others. But that all members will realize and accept that everyone in the church is a sinner some saved by faith and some that the Lord is still wooing. Philippians 2:1-4.
- 29. Pray that visitors to the church will have a positive first experience, from the parking lot to the invitation, and come back for more. Pray that the Lord will grow Cornerstone Church by bringing to it the people that He wants to serve in that location people of all ages, races, and classes. We are all one in Christ. Acts 2:47.
- 30. Pray for of the ministries of the church...and the ministries yet to be developed.

<u>The People of Cornerstone - Senior Pastor, Elders, Staff,</u> Leaders, Teachers, Members and Their Families

Pray that the People of Cornerstone and their families would:

- grow in grace
- be protected from the evil one
- experience the peace of God that surpasses all understanding

Pray for a heart and mind directed towards Christ. - "And let us not grow weary while doing good, for in due season we shall reap if we do not lose heart." (Galatians 6:9)

Pray to have a love for God's Word and to walk in His wisdom, humility, and strength. - "If my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land." (2 Chronicles 7:14)

Pray for God's power and protection against the attacks of the enemy. - "And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock, I will build my church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it." (Matthew 16:18)

Pray for the people to gain wisdom from the Word.

Pray for the people to have perseverance and courage during difficult times.

Pray for the people to honor God in all of their decisions.

Pray for the people to have patience with others.

Prayer for the people's hearts - When a person's heart is aligned with God's will, it influences their decisions, teachings, and the atmosphere around them. Pray for the people's hearts to seek God's guidance and wisdom, and anointing in their actions. Pray for their hearts to be attuned to God's love and truth becoming an inspiration and setting a positive example for the community they live and move in.

Warfare Prayer for the people - We're in a war that we can't see, a spiritual battle. Ephesians 6:12 reminds us that we are in a battle with spiritual forces, not in a physical struggle. We may not see it, The enemy, the dark force, wants us defeated by tempting us with fear, worry, and anxiety. Pray that the people are covered in the full armor of God daily so they can be successful in all they put their hands to do.

Pray for the people's finances. That they are able accomplish the goals set for themselves and their families.

Pray for physical health and mental health of the people. Life can bring about a heavy burden on people, both physically and mentally. Pray for God's favor, healing, protection and direction on what steps the people should take to protect their physical and mental health.

Holiness... Pray that the people will stand their ground against all of the devil's schemes. Pray that they will desire holiness in their inner being.

Humility... We are all called to "be completely humble and gentle." Pray that the people will set that example in their lives, on their jobs, and in their homes. Pray for a spirit of humility for the people.

Pray for wisdom to walk worthy of our calling in Christ in the midst of the temptations of evil all around us.

Pray that our entire church will live lives of continual forgiveness.

Pray for spiritual and financial breakthrough in the lives of our people and for healing of souls.

Pray for a spirit of unity, togetherness, and love to spread across and throughout the church of Cornerstone that will spread throughout our community and nation.

Pray that each family in Cornerstone will be disciplined and focused to practice sound scriptural money management principles, get out of debt, and honor God's Kingdom with our giving.

Pray for spiritual formation in the lives of each church member and in the lives of their family members.

Pray that we develop a real and active relationship with Christ.

Pray for the church to have a love for God's Word and to walk in His wisdom, humility, and strength. - "If my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land." Project Components

- Monthly Objective: Focus on one fruit with supporting verses.
- **Monthly Staff Devotional:** Staff will present a digital devotional monthly associated with the Fruit of the Spirit.
- **Practical Challenge:** The goal is to demonstrate each fruit in real-life situations (e.g., kindness challenge, patience in waiting).
- **Group Sharing:** Discuss progress and encourage accountability within the Connect Groups and ministries.
- OPTIONAL Reflection Journal: Record experiences and insights.

SCRIPTURE REFERENCE: LIVING THE FRUIT OF THE SPIRIT

Galatians 5:22–23 – "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control."

Summary

The Fruit of the Spirit is not a check-list, it's the evidence of God's work in us. These nine qualities reflect Christ's character and grow as we walk in step with the Holy Spirit. The project will run from January 2026 – September 2026.

Reflection on Each Fruit

- 1. **Love** God's love is unconditional. How can you show sacrificial love today? (*John* 13:34)
- 2. **Joy** Joy is rooted in God, not circumstances. What brings you lasting joy? (*Nehemiah* 8:10)
- 3. **Peace** True peace comes from trusting God. Where do you need His peace? (Matthew 5:9)
- 4. **Patience** Waiting with grace honors God. Who needs your patience today? (*Ephesians 4:2*)
- 5. **Kindness** Kindness opens hearts. What simple act of kindness can you offer? *(Ephesians 4:32)*

- 6. **Goodness** Choose what is right even when it's hard. How can you reflect God's goodness? (*Romans 12:21*)
- 7. **Faithfulness** Stay committed in small things. Where can you be more faithful? (Revelation 2:10)
- 8. **Gentleness** Strength under control shows humility. How can you respond gently today? (*Philippians 4:5*)
- 9. **Self-Control** Discipline protects your witness. What area needs surrender to God? (*Proverbs 25:28*)

Examples of Demonstrating the Nine Fruit of the Spirit in Everyday Life

1. Love

- Volunteering to help someone in need without expecting anything in return.
- Showing compassion to someone who is struggling.

2. **Joy**

- Maintaining a positive attitude even during challenging times.
- · Celebrating others' successes wholeheartedly.

3. Peace

- Mediating a conflict between friends calmly and respectfully.
- Choosing forgiveness instead of holding grudges.

4. Patience

- Waiting your turn without complaining, particularly in long lines or traffic.
- Supporting someone who is learning a new skill without frustration.

5. Kindness

- Offering a word of encouragement to someone feeling down.
- Helping carry groceries for an elderly neighbor.

6. Goodness

- Standing up for what is right, even when it's unpopular.
- Returning lost items instead of keeping them.

7. Faithfulness

- Keeping promises and commitments.
- Consistently attending church or Bible study.

8. Gentleness

- Speaking softly and respectfully during disagreements.
- Handling criticism with humility instead of anger.

9. Self-Control

- Resisting the urge to respond harshly when angry.
- Managing time wisely instead of procrastinating.
