Restoring Your Power Source
Acts 18:1-11

Bible Study Discussion Questions

Read together Acts 18: 1-11

1. What things make you feel exhausted – people, situations, work, etc..
2. Why do we so often try to rely on our own power and resist asking for help? Why might this be a problem?
3. What do you think of Paul's response in verse 6? Can you see how it both helped and hindered his work? Can you think of times in your own life when the way you responded helped or hindered your cause? How might you have responded differently?
4. In verse 9, God speaks to Paul in a vision saying, "Do not be afraid; keep on speaking, do not be silent." Why do you think God needed to say that? How has God encouraged you when you've felt afraid or worn out??
5. How does the promise in verse 10—"I am with you... no one is going to attack and harm you" give you inspiration in your life? Do you find it hard or easy to trust God when you're "under attack?" God also told Paul that "there are many people in this city that belong to me." Why do you think that God felt this was important to say to Paul in a vision?
7. If you were Paul, what would have kept you going in Corinth? What's something in your life now that feels like a hard stretch of the journey and how might God be giving you power to persevere?
8. In the three-prong connection – Reach IN (connect with others Believers) Reach Out (share the Good news), and Reach UP (Connect with God) – which are you best at? With which do you need help? How can you encourage and support each other in this?
