Bible Study Discussion Questions: Hebrews 5–7

You can choose to read the entire chapters or just the passages referenced.

1. Hebrews 5:11–14 speaks of spiritual immaturity.

In what areas of your faith do you feel like you're still on "milk," and where have you grown to handle "solid food"?

2. Hebrews 6 gives a sobering warning about falling away.

How do you interpret verses 4–6, and how do you balance that with the hope and assurance found in verses 9–12?

3. In today's church, what do you think causes people to fall or drift away? What can we as a church do to help people stay connected?

4. Hebrews 6:16–20 speaks of God's promise and oath as "unchangeable things."

What does it mean to you that our hope in Christ is called "an anchor for the soul"? How has that hope held you steady in a stormy season?

5. In Hebrews 7, Melchizedek is presented as a type of Christ.

What qualities of Melchizedek stand out to you, and how do they help you understand Jesus' priesthood more deeply?

Why do you think the author of Hebrews emphasizes that Jesus' priesthood is eternal, "in the order of Melchizedek," instead of following the Levitical (Aaron's) line?

6. Hebrews 7:25 says Jesus lives to intercede for us.

What does that mean for your daily walk with God—and how might it affect your prayer life and/or sense of security in Christ?

7. Overall, how do these chapters challenge or encourage your understanding of Jesus' role as both Savior and Priest?

What's one takeaway you feel prompted to live out this week?
