**Hebrews 9: 11-15; 23-28**  
**Hope Has a Price: The Once and Done Dirt Remover**  
**Week of June 1, 2025**

**Group Discussion Guide**

**Opening Reflection:**

Read Hebrews 9: 11-15, 23-28 aloud as a group. Take a moment to reflect on what stands out to you in this passage

1. **What do these verses reveal about the cost of our hope in Christ?**  
How does understanding that Jesus entered the heavenly sanctuary with *His own blood* impact your view of salvation?
  
2. **Verse 12 says Christ "once and for all time secured our eternal redemption."**  
How does that differ from the High Priests forgiveness of sins; aka "Wash, Rinse, Repeat"
  
3. **How do verses 24–26 challenge our ideas about temporary fixes versus eternal solutions?**  
What kinds of "quick fixes" do people often place their hope in, and how does Christ's once-for-all sacrifice stand apart? Think about examples Pastor Doug used in his sermon -- Scratches on the floor; surface cleaning vs deep cleaning, only focusing on tough spots; relying on someone else to do the "dirty work."
  
4. **In verse 28, it says Christ will appear a second time to bring salvation to those who are waiting for Him.**  
What does knowing that accepting Jesus as your savior means that He himself -- Jesus -- will stand in your place on judgment day and you will receive mercy mean to you?
  
5. **Knowing that our hope cost Jesus everything, how should that shape the way we share it with others?**  
In what ways can we live more intentionally in light of the high price of hope?

**Wrap-Up Action for the Week:**

Identify one person in your life who seems to be losing hope. Reach out to them this week—whether through a call, a coffee, or a simple encouraging message—and be intentional about reminding them of the costly and powerful hope we have in Christ. Let your actions reflect the value of the gift you've received.
