Hope Helps People – Discussion Questions on Hebrews 13

- 1. Hebrews 13:1-2 encourages love and hospitality.** In Sunday's Message, Scott talked about hospitality not necessarily meaning opening your home (although it could be!) but in making people/strangers feel welcomed, comforted and valued. How can you practice hospitality in your everyday life?
- 2. Verse 3 reminds us to remember those in prison and who are mistreated.** How does the hope we have in Christ – sinners that we are – help us show empathy and solidarity with people who are suffering?
- 3. Marriage and contentment are addressed in verses 4-5.** In what ways does Christian hope help us navigate personal relationships and desires with faithfulness and peace?
- 4. “Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you” (v. 5b).** How does this promise give you hope in times of fear, loneliness, or transition?
- 5. Verse 6 boldly declares, “The Lord is my helper.”** What difference does it make in your life to believe that God is actively helping you—and how can you pass that help on to others?
- 6. Verse 7 encourages us to remember our leaders and imitate their faith.** Who has modeled hopeful, faith-filled living for you—and how can you be that person for someone else?
- 7. Hebrews 13:14 says, “We are looking for the city that is to come.”** How does keeping an eternal perspective give us hope to endure and serve others today?
- 8. The chapter closes with a prayer that God would equip us for doing His will (v. 20-21).** How does this promise in God's power to transform and equip us change how we approach our daily lives and relationships?
