Can you imagine seeing what John saw? It would just blow my mind to see people from all across the world worshiping the Lord together in their own languages. It is not just a vision though. What John saw is a promise of what is to come when Christ returns and all who have trusted in Him will gather around the throne to worship the Lamb.

So, what stands between us now and that vision realized? As Paul Chitwood, the President of the IMB, says, "The world's greatest problem...LOSTNESS!" There are many problems facing our world because of sin, but the greatest is lostness. The world's population is estimated to have passed 8 billion people and 40% of them live in areas with little to no access to the Gospel. Our response is a commitment to the Great Commission to make the Gospel known among our neighbors and the nations until the Great Multitude gathers around the throne.

One way you can be a part of that is to be radically generous above and beyond your tithes and offerings by giving to the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering for the International Mission Board (IMB). 100% of gifts given to this special offering go to support missionaries on the field like our partners in South Asia. Your gifts allow them to stay on the field, and not have to worry about if support will come in or need to come home to raise support.

Our goal as a church is \$3300, a 10% increase of our goal last year. Through December and January, we will be called to pray for our missionaries and the nations in a variety of ways. One way will be flags of different nations on the stage. Each Sunday, children will bring in a flag representing \$110 given to the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering until we hit the goal of \$3300. After they bring the flags in, we will spend time as a church praying for one of the regions that the IMB is working. This Christmas, as you celebrate the coming of Christ as Savior, remember to pray for the billions who have not heard that joyous news and consider how you can give sacrificially so that more can go to the nations with the Good News of Christ.

Pray for God to give you opportunities to reach these people.

As a church, we have a goal to give \$3,300. To mark our progress, a flag from a different nation will be placed on the platform each Sunday for every \$110 given to the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering. To give to this special offering, either use the LMCO envelope, write "Lottie Moon" on a HBC offering envelope, or select "Lottie Moon" when giving online.

LOTTIE MOON CHRISTMAS POST OFFICE: Sending out Christmas Cards this year to members and regular attenders at Heartland? Rather than buying a stamp from the US Post Office, send the card with the Lottie Moon Post Office and help send missionaries to the nations at the same time.
