

Sermon Title: Bedrock - Evangelism Scripture Reference: Romans 10:13-15

Connection:

Application:

1. Why Do We Share the Gospel?

Main Passage: Romans 10:13-15

Paul lays out the logical chain of evangelism, people are saved because someone told them.

What does this passage reveal about our personal responsibility in evangelism?

What might be some reasons Christians hesitate to "tell"?

2 God's Heart for the Lost

Read: Luke 15:1-7 (The Parable of the Lost Sheep)

What does this story teach us about God's attitude toward those far from Him?

How can our church mirror this same heart in our community events and daily lives?

3. Everyday Evangelism

Read: 1 Peter 3:15-16

Peter says to always be ready to explain your hope "with gentleness and respect."

What are some natural, non-threatening ways to share your faith in everyday settings?

How can gentleness and respect make evangelism more effective?

4. Sent to Serve

Main Passage: Matthew 28:18-20

Jesus said, "Go and make disciples..."

What does it mean to live as someone who is sent?

How can serving others (like at Trunks of Treats) open doors for spiritual conversations?

5. Power for the Mission

Read: Acts 4:29-31

The early church prayed for boldness in proclaiming God's word. How does this challenge us?

What might it look like for you or your small group to pray and act with that same boldness this week?
