

Sermon Title: Heroes Of Faith - Daniel

Scripture Reference: Daniel 1-6

Connection:

1. Faithfulness Under Pressure

Daniel refused the king's food because he didn't want to compromise his devotion to God.

Question:

Where do you personally feel pressure to conform today, and what would faithfulness look like in that area?

2. Faith That Shapes the Future

Daniel's long-term obedience positioned him for influence and protection.

Question:

Can you identify a season where obedience protected you from later hardship, or where compromise created future challenges?

Additional Reading: Psalm 1:1-6

3. "Even If He Doesn't" Faith

Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego displayed a resolve that trusted God regardless of the outcome.

Question:

Is there an area of life right now where you need that kind of "even if He doesn't" faith?

Additional Reading: Hebrews 11:32-40

4. Trusting God's Verdict Over People's Verdict

Daniel lived from God's approval rather than human approval.

Question:

Where are you most tempted to live for people's opinions, and what would it look like to live from God's verdict instead?

5. The Influence of a Faithful Life

Daniel's consistent faith affected kings, officials, friends, and entire nations.

Question:

How does your personal faith influence the people around you, your family, workplace, or community? What area of influence might God be prompting you to strengthen?
