

Sermon Title: The Arrival Of The Shepherds

Scripture Reference: Luke 2:8-20

### **Application:**

### 1. Feeling Overlooked

The shepherds were socially marginalized, yet God chose them to receive the first announcement of Jesus' birth.

- In what areas of your life do you sometimes feel overlooked, unseen, or unimportant?
- How does knowing that God intentionally chose the shepherds challenge the way you see your own worth?

### 2. God Uses the Willing

## Additional Scripture: 1 Corinthians 1:26-29 (NLT)

- What stands out to you about how God chooses people throughout Scripture?
- Are there areas where you've been waiting to feel "ready" before saying yes to God? What might willingness look like for you right now?

# 3. Mary vs. the Shepherds: Different Callings, Same Faithfulness Additional Scripture: Ecclesiastes 3:1 (NLT)

- How do you discern whether God is calling you to speak, act, wait, or reflect in a particular season of your life?
- Which role do you naturally gravitate toward, and which stretches you more?

# 4. Same Life, New Heart Additional Scripture: Colossians 3:17 (NLT)

- The shepherds returned to the same jobs, same fields, same routines, but changed.
- What would it look like for your everyday life (work, family, routines) to be shaped by worship and gratitude rather than circumstance?

# 5. What Are We Really Praying For? Additional Scripture: Psalm 51:10 (NLT)

- How often do your prayers focus on God changing your circumstances versus changing your heart?
- Is there an area where God may be inviting you to pray less for external change and more for internal transformation?
