Pastor's Letter



Dear friends,

March is a liturgically rich month as we continue our journey through Lent to Easter. Gathering on

Sundays and Wednesdays, we continue our sermon series "Table Talk with Jesus" until we arrive at Holy Week. Several significant services occur from Palm/Passion Sunday to Easter. In this edition of the *Penn Street Letter* you will find a full listing of Holy Week worship offerings.

As we prepare for Holy Week and Easter, the following brief reflections from our current *Book of Common Worship* provide an opportunity to prepare for the richness of this month.

Palm/Passion Sunday, March 24, "is, by design, a day of drama and paradox, of triumph and tragedy. As the service begins, a crowd gathers, waving branches, and shouting 'Hosanna' and wanting to crown Jesus as king. But as the story of Christ's passion unfolds, the shouts of praise turn into demands for his death. The service is established on the theological principle that Jesus' death and resurrection cannot be separated. It insists that we not avoid the cross – God's way of glory leads through the grave." Maundy Thursday, March 28, "proclaims Jesus' new commandment to love one another as he has loved us. It celebrates Christ's example of humble service and self-offering, represented by the washing of feet and the sharing of communion."

Good Friday, March 29, "proclaims the good news of salvation through the paradoxical suffering and death of our Lord Jesus Christ. The center of this liturgy is the reading of the passion narrative from one of the gospels."

Easter, March 31, celebrating the "Resurrection of the Lord, is the center of the Christian year, and the good news we proclaim on this day is the very heart of the gospel. Theologically, the faith we claim and the life we live depend on the affirmation, celebration, and proclamation of Christ's resurrection."

May our worship this month draw us more deeply into the love of God through Jesus Christ.



Be Inspired

What Makes You Come Alive? Sundays, March 3-April 14



Howard Thurman

"Don't ask what the world needs. Ask what makes you come alive and go do that, because what the world needs is more people who have come alive." -Howard Thurman

Do you recognize the quote but not the name, Howard Thurman? Would you be surprised that in the early 1950's Time magazine named him one of the ten most

significant religious leaders in America (a list that also included Norman Vincent Peale and Billy Graham)?

Now, are you still wondering why you don't recognize this man?

When the Civil Rights Movement took shape in the United States, Thurman was a nationally recognized human rights advocate, though he did not take to marching and mobilizing in the streets. He preferred to serve as a caretaker and spiritual advisor to those who did, among them Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., Jesse Jackson, Marian Wright Edelman, and John Lewis. Dr. King was known to carry his Bible and a copy of Thurman's Jesus and the Disinherited with him at all times.

While in India, a meeting with Mahatma Gandhi convinced Thurman and his wife Sue of the nonviolent path. Then while viewing the Kyber Pass they also became convinced of interracial, interfaith worship. Together they would work to facilitate The Church for the Fellowship of All Peoples, a church that Eleanor Roosevelt supported in its inception.

A mystic, a prophet, a mentor... Howard Thurman was this and more! Please join this six-week class on *Howard Thurman: What Makes You Come Alive?* as it begins on Sunday, March 3 and continues through April 14 during the 10 a.m. church school hour each week. Kay Love and Karen Hosch will facilitate this study using video and several of Howard Thurman's books. Register at fpcfw. org/spiritualformation or by calling the church office (817.335.1231).

Wrestling with Faith, Racial Equity, Power and Privilege: Sundays, March 24, April 7-May 26

"And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly, to love mercy and walk humbly with your God." *Micah 6.8*

"...I realized that I [took this calling] not only to improve our economy, but also out of a belief in the unseen: a promised land of a caring, just society." *Heather McGhee in The Sum of Us*

How can we live into our responsibility as Christians to strive toward a caring, just society? In this course we will share our own experiences and explore those related by author Heather McGhee in her book, *The Sum of Us: What Racism Costs Everyone and How We Can Prosper Together* (2021). In our weekly reflections we will seek to recognize the need for constructive change in our society that benefits not only a privileged few, but rather all of us in ways consistent with Jesus' message for the world, and with God's vision of Shalom that calls for justice. We hope that such sharing might lead participants to deeper spiritual and cultural connections and an opportunity for individual growth in faith.

Please join this nine-week course, Sundays from 4-6 p.m. in Room 238, beginning with an "opening retreat" on March 24, and (skipping Easter Sunday) continuing through May 26. Mark Beasley and Martha Newman will facilitate this study using videos, dialogs that allow God to teach, as well as McGhee's book, *The Sum of Us*.
