Summer Enneagram Workshops

Ever felt misunderstood? Ever wondered why some things trigger deep responses in you? Or - ever had someone say to you, "You're getting in your own way?" Suddenly, you go inward and start wondering.

Learning who we are and what our potentials could be is a lifetime journey that can be pleasant and painful. No doubt you've heard your favorite "pop" analyst offer lots of free advice about any of the questions above, but do we trust quick and easy information about ourselves? Delving into our emotions and our motivations takes focus, time, and work. Self work is serious and it becomes soul work when done well.

For many years First Pres offered workshops on the enneagram, an ancient wisdom about personality and how it works. Now these seminars are being offered again by the Spiritual Formation Committee. Join Carol Toombs, Linda Northern, and Karen Hosch on three Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Cost is \$15 and includes continental breakfast and lunch. - June 15: Know Your Number. Learn the basics of Enneagram theory - centers of intelligence, triads, and stances. Identify your number.
- June 29: Growing into your Healthiest Self. Learn how to use energy from your wings and stress and security numbers, to deal with lost childhood messages and wounds so that they no longer control you.
- July 13: Growing Home: The Spirituality of the Enneagram. Learn about Holy Ideas and Virtues as well as spiritual practices for each number as it moves toward integration and reconnects with essence.

Engage the World

In April, members of First Pres traveled to Honduras for a solar mission trip. In partnership with Solar Under the Sun and the Presbyterian Church of Honduras, the group installed solar power for ten homes and a church over the course of five days.

Solar Under the Sun is a covenant partner of the Synod of the Sun, a governing body of the Presbyterian Church (USA). Believing that Jesus Christ is the Light of the world, the vision of Solar Under the Sun is to illumine our fellow human beings with hope and life through solar energy by training volunteers to design and install solar power systems in communities that lack reliable electrical power.
