Daily readings from September-May are arranged in such a way that the connections between the books of the Bible and the overarching themes and story cycles of scripture come together to reveal the unity of the Bible.

Bible In-Depth

Sundays 10-10:45 a.m. or Wednesdays 10:45-11:45 a.m.

This popular course is offered twice a week (choose one) on Sunday mornings from 10-10:45 a.m., and Wednesday mornings from 10:45 -11:45 a.m. Led by the Rev. Dr. Robyn Michalove (Sunday Class) and the Rev. Dr. Michael Waschevski (Wednesday Class), a book of the Bible is studied verse by verse. Throughout the study participants grow in their understanding of scripture and its application to their daily life of faith. The fall session begins on Sunday, September 8, or Wednesday, September 11 with a study of First and Second Corinthians.

Desmond Tutu wrote a book, God Has a Dream. And in it. he echoes MLK, saying, "God says to you, 'I have a dream. Please help me to realize it. It is a dream of a world whose ugliness and squalor and poverty, its war and hostility, its greed and harsh competitiveness, its alienation and disharmony are changed into their glorious counterparts. When there will be more laughter, joy, and peace, where there will be justice and goodness and compassion and love and caring and sharing. I have a dream that my children will know that they are members of one family, the human family – *my* family." These men took a comprehensive

These men took a comprehensive look at scripture and recognized that God's vision for how we were to live with one another and with God permeates all of scripture. MLK called the dream, "the beloved community;" Desmund Tutu, "Ubuntu." The Old Testament calls it "Shalom;" the New Testament, "Eirene."

This 8-week course led by Carol Toombs will trace God's dream of shalom as introduced in Genesis and fulfilled in Revelation, exploring the richness of shalom blessings and the urgency of human responsibility in co-creating it. The course will examine how, through covenants, law, prophets, Jesus Christ, and the early church, God's dream was both kept alive and revealed in ever greater depth.

Pastor's Letter



Over the summer we have been exploring our top 16 hymns as voted by you, the congregation of First Pres. Many of these hymns elicit a faith that is based

in love and unity. Two things that, in recent memory, seem to be more elusive than prevalent in our culture. In my roles as both a pastor and a therapist I have been experiencing increased levels of cultural anxiety this year as we near the November elections.

It's times like these that I am drawn back to words from scripture and modern mystics for grounding. Being reminded to operate from a place of love, rather than fear, is needed. I find that these two quotes, from the 20th Century Trappist monk Thomas Merton and Jesus, have a helpful way of offering that grounding perspective.

Thomas Merton said, "But to love another as a person we must begin by granting him his own autonomy and identity as a person. We have to love him for what he is in himself, and not for what he is to us. We have to love him for his own good, not for the good we get out of him."

In Matthew, Jesus says, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments."

We know within our being that these moral guideposts are the path to right relationships. Yet, when the rubber meets the road, when we're faced with people who don't look like us or don't act like us, or who push against our expectations, how do we find ourselves responding? Is it out of a place of love or a place of fear? How do we respond to those who disagree with our point of view?

Relationships are hard in the best of times, so this year as the collective anxiety and worry continue to increase, we must strive, even more diligently, to operate from a place of love. If you are looking for practical skills to stay grounded in your faith and be in relationship from a place of love over fear then join us for a workshop on Sunday, August 25 at 2 p.m. The workshop will help frame our relationships with family, friends, and even strangers, from a theological perspective while also empowering us to live out our faith in this season.
