Pastor's Letter



Dear friends,
I heard once that when FBI agents learn to identify a counterfeit bill, their focus is not what you'd think. Instead of studying the counterfeits,

they are trained to study and memorize the original. By immersing themselves in the real thing (i.e. holding, touching, smelling, seeing), they learn to detect the fake bills almost instantly, without having to stop and study them carefully. In a similar way, followers of Christ discover that it is better to get to know the real thing (rather than concentrating on all the issues we oppose and disagree with) in order to learn to identify and discern God's activity in the world.

Dr. Kenda Dean was one of my favorite professors during my time at Princeton Seminary. A while back, she wrote a haunting book entitled, *Almost Christian: What the Faith of Our Teenagers is Telling the American Church*. Among all else in this book, she teaches that our vocation as disciples "has always been more of a trust-walk than a belief system." She writes:

"In Christian tradition, faith depends on who we follow, and that depends on who we love. Believing in a person—having utter confidence in someone—creates a very different set of expectations than believing in 'beliefs.' For Christians, faith means cleaving to the person, the

God-man, of Jesus Christ, joining a pilgrim journey with other lovers and following him into the world. Christian formation invites young people into this motley band of pilgrims and prepares them to receive the Spirit who calls them, shapes them, and enlists them in God's plan to right a capsized world."

I love the words she uses to paint a picture of Christian formation: "prepares, calls, shapes, enlists." So very true.

"Follow me" is the challenge Jesus asks of his disciples. We hear this in the Bible as well as in our own relationships with Jesus. I don't know about you, but I am fascinated by his approach. Jesus does not ask us to sign off on a set of beliefs and values before we formally become disciples, nor does Jesus offer a reward or incentive for following him. Instead, Jesus gives us one piece of advice, one instruction: "Follow me." And, of course, it is advice that is just as simple as it is complex, just as easy as it is challenging.

What does it mean to you that God *prepares, calls, shapes, and enlists* you and your fellow Christ followers? I'd love to hear from you about this. I'm thinking about it too. See you Sunday.

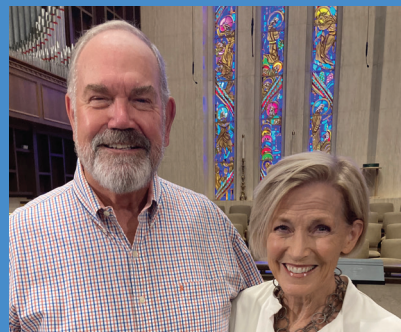
