Celebrate Josh Stewart's 20th Anniversary as Associate Pastor





here in Fort Worth.
The scorching heat
reminds us just
how critical it is

to be a place of welcome, shelter, and compassion—especially for our neighbors without homes or access to cooling.

I am especially grateful for the ministry of Room in the Inn - an ecumenical ministry that brings churches across Fort Worth together to provide dignity, friendship, and safe overnight shelter to those experiencing homelessness during the hottest months of the year. Every Monday night during July and August, volunteers at First Pres have shared meals, laughter, cool air, and genuine community with our guests. It's a ministry that transforms both those who serve and those who are served—and it embodies the heart of our faith. I am thankful that we are marking our 15th year of hospitality with Room in the Inn and for the many volunteers (innkeepers, bus drivers, meal providers, laundry volunteers, bedmakers, hospitality team and more!) who are committed to this critical ministry in our community.

In addition to Room in the Inn, our Community Crossroads campus continues to be a vital hub of mercy and justice. Once again this summer we are an official Cooling Station partnering with the City of Fort Worth, and this year we are one of only 2 in our city who offer air conditioning and respite from the heat for unhoused neighbors. And also, this space is more than just cool air—it is a sign of God's love made tangible.

In this season of heat and hardship, may we continue to be a church that brings shade and light, refuge and renewal. Thank you for being a people of mission, showing Christ's hospitality to our neighbors near and far. Stay cool, stay connected, and stay faithful.

Ministry Spotlight: First HAND Food Outreach

Hospitality · Advocacy · Nurture · Dignity









At Community Crossroads, our First Hands Ministry lives out Christ's call to feed and care for our neighbors through multiple food access points that honor choice, dignity, and relationship.

Each Monday and every third Thursday evening, our choice pantry allows neighbors to walk through and select their own groceries—an empowering experience that reinforces dignity and agency. On Wednesdays and Thursdays, we offer a walk-up and drive-thru grocery distribution, providing produce, meat, bread, and pantry staples to anyone in need. We also prepare non-perishable sack lunches for our unhoused neighbors, available Mondays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays.

This is the largest ministry at Crossroads, serving over 500 individuals and families each week - and it takes a village! Volunteers arrive as early as 6:45 a.m. on Thursdays to unload delivery trucks, sort produce, bag groceries, prep sack lunches, and serve our neighbors with care and compassion. Each role is vital: from computer check-in to car loading, every task contributes to the heart of this ministry.

We would love to have you join us. There are many ways to get involved:

- Mondays: 8 a.m. 1:30 p.m.
- Wednesdays: 8 a.m. 1:30 p.m.
- Thursdays: 6:45 a.m. 1:30 p.m.

In June 2025, Community Crossroads:

- Provided 1,447 households with groceries
- Provided 318 individuals with clothing
- · Served **793** sack lunches
- Provided pet food to 380 pet owners
- Provided **187** hygiene items to individuals
- Provided 178 cleaning products to individuals
- Provided 742 packages of diapers and 219 cans of formula to parents
- · Served **39** dental patients
- A dedicated team of 204 volunteers contributed a remarkable total of 1,938 hours of service!













During the week of July 21, 40 kids, 10 grandfriends, plus several youth and adult sponsors, gathered for Mission on the Move—a powerful, hands-on experience of learning and service. Through visits to local ministries like Community Crossroads, and Taste Community Kitchen, participants explored what it means to live with compassion, serve, and grow in community.
