Pastor's Letter



Dear friends.

I've had a number of conversations lately about what it means to live intentionally right now. Whether you

are raising young children, making decisions to downsize your housing, thinking about how you might live out your faith, or considering how to find a slice of silence in the day-to-day hustle, living with intention seems to be difficult to grasp. I've heard you say, "the hits keep coming," "I'm just surviving," "We have one thing after another." And, all of that is true.

It's almost as if our pace of life has usurped our abilities to think through what we find important, meaningful, life-giving. We're floating from one activity to the next, one decision to the next and there's not much space for discernment, consideration, intentionality. I wonder, what would it look like to actually be able to think through your life goals, your family goals, or even think through just the next few weeks without being constrained by a to-do list?

Turns out scripture has some insight for us on living intentionally. Colossians 3.17 says "And whatever you do, whether in word or deed,

do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him." Proverbs 16.3 says "Commit to the Lord whatever you do, and he will establish your plans." Romans 12.2 says "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect."

There is no escaping the speed at which life is happening around us or to us, but the way we respond to it can certainly be more intentional. And, I would propose that our path forward, no matter which season of life we're in, should be grounded in the intention of love. Dorothy Day says, "there is nothing we can do but love, and dear God, please enlarge our hearts to love each other, to love our neighbor, to love our enemy as our friend." May we at least have that intention as we head into this season of added holiday delight and stress. May love be our guiding intention in all the activities to which we proclaim a resounding yes and those we decline, may love be our guiding intention as we struggle through hard relationships, and may you be reminded of the God who claims you, loves you, and invites you into abundant life.


