

Planning Ahead: First Pres Memorial Garden prices to increase January 1

Did you know First Pres offers a peaceful final resting place right here on our church grounds? Our Memorial Garden, located on the north side of the church facing Texas Street, provides three meaningful options for members and their families who choose cremation.

Now is a great time to plan ahead - for the first time, prices will increase on January 1, 2026, following a recent Session vote.

Memorial Garden Options:


- **Scattering:** Ashes are scattered in the central flower bed, with the name and dates engraved on our memorial wall.
- **Interment:** Cremains are buried in a biodegradable box beneath the jasmine near the labyrinth, with a plaque on the memorial wall.
- Columbarium: Niches hold up to two urns, with names and dates engraved on both the urn and niche faceplate. Over half of our 160 niches have already been reserved.

Each option includes a brief committal service led by one of our pastors.

If this is something you've been meaning to take care of, now is the time. Many have shared how relieved they felt to have this decision made.

As we head into colder weather, **please consider donating men's athletic shoes, winter coats, and blankets** to help keep our community warm this season.


