Through Jonah's flight, prayer, preaching, frustration and transformation, we'll discover a God who pursues us when we flee, awaits us when we pray, works through us when we try, stretches us when we resist and amazes us with patience and persistence.

This series reminds us that God's mercy is faster than our fear and reaches farther than we ever imagined. Through every storm and every second chance, God remains present, compassionate and ready to meet us.

Whether you are encountering Jonah's story for the first time or returning to it with fresh questions, come discover a mercy that pursues, restores and transforms.

Pastor's Letter



Dear friends,

Throughout all of Scripture, God is known by many names. God is the God of Abraham, the God who makes promises and keeps covenant. God is the God of Sarah, the God who brings laughter out of impossibility. God is the God of Jacob, the God who wrestles with schemers and strivers and somehow refuses to let them go. God is the God of Moses, the God who hears the cries of people in bondage and leads them toward freedom. And this fall at First Pres, we are going to spend some time with another description of God: The God of Jonah.

This fall, we are going to journey through the entire book of Jonah together. It is a wonderfully strange little book filled with storms and sailors, prayers and prophets, a giant fish, an enormous city, a fast-growing plant, a hungry worm, and even some confused cattle. But for all the attention the fish gets, Jonah really isn't a story about a fish. And I am increasingly convinced it isn't primarily a story about a prophet who runs away from God either. Jonah is a story about a God whose mercy outruns human expectations.

Jonah runs away as God pursues. Jonah sinks, however, God provides. Jonah reluctantly tries, yet God works through him anyway. Jonah gets angry because God is too merciful while God patiently stays with Jonah even in the midst of that anger. Over and over again, Jonah discovers that

God's mercy moves fast. Much faster than he does.

And if we are willing to be truthful, there is probably a little Jonah in all of us. We know something about running. We know something about resisting. We know something about wanting God to be gracious to us while being a little less certain about God's grace for others. Yet through every storm, every detour, and every second chance, Jonah introduces us to a God whose patience is persistent and whose mercy stretches further than we ever imagined.

We are especially excited that during the sixth week of this series we will welcome Rabbi Sharon Brous to join us in worship. Her presence will give us a wonderful opportunity to encounter this ancient Jewish text alongside an amazing Jewish teacher and friend and to think together about the questions of mercy, justice, repentance, and our shared life with God that Jonah continues to raise.

So this fall, come meet Jonah. Not the cartoon character with the whale. The complicated prophet who runs and prays and preaches and pouts.

And, even more importantly, come encounter Jonah's God — the God who pursues us when we flee, awaits us when we pray, works through us when we try, stretches us when we resist, and continually amazes us with that divine patience and persistence.
