FROM THE PRINCIPAL



A movie I have always enjoyed is Pollyanna starring Haley Mills. It's an oldie, but the message is always releanksgiving vant. In the movie, Mills plays the irrepressible Pollyanna. She has a firm belief that there is nothing in life that can't be overcome with an optimistic spirit and a can-do attitude. As an orphan, she is taken in by her Aunt, and through a variety of adventures, spreads her special type

of joy to the entire town. In each situation that she encounters, Pollyanna tries to find the positive. For example, she employs a method called "The Glad Game." In the game, Pollyanna teaches her new friends that in every situation there is something to be found for which one can be glad. For example, as a missionary kid, she received a care box, and instead of toys, it contained crutches. Pollyanna noted that she was glad that she didn't need to use them!

As Christian brothers and sisters, we have our own version of The Glad Game. You can see it right there in Paul's letter to the Philippians, "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice. Let your reasonableness be known to everyone. The Lord is at hand; do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." (4:4-7, ESV)

In these last several months, our church and school family has experienced our fair share of conflict and challenges. I have personally experienced the sting of gossip, hurtful comments, and some false assumptions being made about how I lead our school ministry team and manage the budget. I have seen the hurt my sisters in Christ that work with me in the office have experienced. There are days when my team and I feel discouraged and disheartened. We are reminded that we serve a God that reminds us to "Rejoice in the Lord always." And we do. We rejoice that God continues to use our school ministry to reach into the hearts and lives of hundreds of children each year. We rejoice that God enables us to offset a huge portion of our school ministry expenses with tuition dollars. We rejoice that our school ministry is blessed to be an outreach of a congregation that has provided for the needs of physical space and all that entails. We rejoice that no matter what is said about us, we are still God's dearly loved children. And we rejoice in the graciousness of so many congregation members as they raise up in prayer and express words of encouragement.

As His children, we are working hard in our school ministry to carry out the work Christ has called us through our Calls and contracts to do. We strive to provide an excellent academic experience that is Christ-centered and student-focused. We work to ensure that every student that attends our school has their needs met and that they meet Jesus in the process. We do, in fact, work diligently to carefully manage our income and expenses in a way that demonstrates careful stewardship—keeping in mind that the most valuable gift God has entrusted to our stewardship care is the hearts and minds of the students that walk through our doors each day. We balance limited resources with the pressure from parents that have high expectations for a private, Lutheran school education balanced with the understanding that our resources are not unlimited. We, like you, know that we all have room for improvement. We seek to be better each day as we serve Jesus and the people He has called into our midst. We invite you to stop by to discuss any questions you might have!

As His children, we know that there are some anxious hearts in our congregation when it comes to school ministry and how it operates. We pray along with you, that God would continue to give us reason to rejoice in all things—including our school ministry. It is a treasure with which God has blessed our congregation. As we seek to serve Him in all things, we are reminded to trust Him in all things. We are all in this together, dear brothers and sisters. As your school principal, I desire to see this congregation thrive and flourish. We are all on the same team. We're not always going to agree on how to get things done, but God continues to give us good work to do. And the good work you and I are doing in school ministry and all of the other ministries at Cross is important kingdom-building work. God is using you and me to communicate Christ's love to the community gathered here at Cross, to New Braunfels, and to the world! Please keep the school ministry staff in your prayers. Raise Right (Scrip)

Did you know that purchasing a gift card through the Raise Right (Scrip) program can help pay off the debt on the church building? When you buy an HEB, Walmart, Walgreen or any one of the 700 cards available a portion goes to the church and benefits a couple of programs. The rebate on a card is divided

between the rebate account which pays for shipping of the cards and an account of your choice. You can choose to donate to the Building Fund, Youth Group, Camp Lone Camp Fees, School Endowment Fund (scholarships), and School Tuition. Between January and



June, \$301.25 has been given to the Building Fund with \$60.17 given to the School Endowment Fund.

You can purchase cards before Sunday School or online. When you purchase online and choose an e-gift card there are no shipping charges and the card is available within 5 minutes. You can purchase online with a credit card or with your bank account. When you connect your bank account you only pay \$0.15 per transaction.

We all go to HEB and Walmart for groceries or gas. Use a gift card and give a little back to the church. Stop by the kitchen on Sunday mornings, grab a taco, donut and cup of coffee and talk with Alissa about setting up an account or just pick up a gift card.
