

Summer of Blessings

This year we had an awesome summer of ministry, outreach events, and programs at the Ministry Center. I thank the Lord for Kathryn Hoelscher, Children's Director, our staff, pastors, and especially all the servants in ministry who participated.

The new outdoor format for our *Childrens Day Celebration* in May was very successful. We were able to connect with many new families, some of whom began attending worship services at our 1604 Campus and the Ministry Center. Many of these families enrolled their children in our *Project Transformation* summer reading camp, participated in *Vacation Bible School*, served at our *Food Pantry*, and other ministries. We capped off the summer with our annual *Backto-School Celebration* that provided much needed backpacks and school supplies to 300 students within our community.

Through these ministries we were blessed to see how God is moving in the places we serve. One event in July that was a highlight for me was the baptism service that we held at the Guadalupe River. Nineteen people in our community listened to God's call and chose to dedicate their lives to Christ through baptism. This group included ten children, eight youth, and one adult. This was so important and meaningful to me because our purpose and mission has always been centered around reaching more people for Christ and helping our neighbors to grow in their

relationship with our Lord. These baptisms confirmed to me that God is continuing to use our church and our ministries to his glory. It was also an affirmation that what we do makes a difference in the lives of people in our community.

Community ministry takes time, and the fruits of our obedience to the Lord's call may not be immediately evident. We must be patient and remember that all the work we do in the name of the Lord makes an impact on the lives of others. Over the last seven years most of the children and youth who were baptized participated in the Ministry Center events and programs that I spoke of earlier. Many were regulars at our weekly

homework help program that we held at their apartment community. Their parents knew us and the ministry servants who helped in those ministries. These parents wanted their children to be baptized in a Christian Church that loves the Lord and reaches out into their community.

I must say that there were times over the past several years where I was concerned that we had only baptized a few individuals at the La Roca service. This year alone, we have baptized 22 and I pray that the Lord will bring more. God is doing some awesome things at Northern Hills, and I thank the Lord that I have been able to witness his wonderful work.










New and Improved Food Pantry!



Over the last month, the food pantry has had a lot of changes. We have moved from the back of the building to the front two classrooms of the Ministry Center. This move has allowed the food pantry to become a Client-Choice model and will be open for clients Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 9:00 a.m. - 3:40 p.m. Clients will now make an appointment and come shop for their own groceries. With this new way

of distribution, it empowers the clients by giving them the choice of what foods they want instead of just a handout. We have created a small grocery store for them to shop in with shopping carts included! The amount of food they can shop for is based on family size.

If you are looking for a place to help during the day, we are in need of a lot of helpers! We pick up food from the San Antonio Food Bank on Monday mornings and unload it into our grocery store. If you can lift 50 pounds, your help is needed from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. If you are not a heavy lifter, we can use you Tuesday-Thursday. Helpers will assist with shopping, checking out clients, stocking shelves, helping take groceries to cars, and bringing back our shopping carts. This is where you see the intervention -Tyler, the drummer, is an EMT and he was subbing that morning, Miranda, a nurse, usually works on Sundays, she was off and came to church, Whitney was there, she's a cardiac nurse, someone called out to the congregation if anyone had a glucose pin, someone did, Heather, singer in the band went and grabbed the church defibrillator and someone called 911. All of these people jumped in to help until EMS arrived. God put all of these people in this place at one time for us. It was an emotional day. Charlie spent 3 days in the hospital. Overall he is feeling better, but has his days. He has an ablation procedure was scheduled on October 12. We are hoping this fixes the problem and he can get back to a regular schedule.











