### **THE GATHERING OF GOD'S PEOPLE**

#### **WORSHIP REFLECTION**

Today, we examine the fifth piece of our armor called "the helmet of salvation."

That which adorns and protects the Christian, which enables him to hold up his head with confidence and joy, is the fact that he is saved and that he knows his salvation will be perfected in the end.
