The Session Nominating Committee has interviewed each of the new candidates for office. In addition, Nominating Committee members participated in the training classes for this group of candidates to better know them. Pastor Dick Cain, who taught the officer training, stated, and the Nominating Committee agrees, that "this is probably the most educated class of new elders to come through training." All five of the new elder candidates have seminary training and a variety of experience to bring to the Session. Also, each of the new deacon candidates is an experienced businessmen who has demonstrated a genuine desire to use his gifts to serve our church.

Realizing that we have many new church members, and with two services making it hard to get to know people who may be in the other service, the following information about each candidate is offered here.

New Elder Candidates:



Tommy Austin grew up in this church. He came to know the Lord in his youth being raised in a Christian home. Tommy worked at a church after college and then attended Gordon Conwell Seminary before returning to Chattanooga and entering the real estate realm. He was an Elder at Northshore fellowship for several years before coming back to us about two years ago. He and his wife, Jeanne, have four grown children.
