WORSHIP REFLECTIONS

In our sermon text this morning, we learn about Paul's thorn that is not removed by the Lord in spite of Paul's focused prayers for its removal. There is an important lesson for all of us to learn: "The thing that troubles you right now, the thing that pains you, that frustrates you, the thing that burdens you the most and you wish you could get rid of . . . may be the very thing you want to keep . . . for it is the thing which will make God very dear to you and make you most useful for Him."

A lesson from Paul's unanswered prayer for his thorn's removal: Is the chief end of praying to get our prayers answered? Why pray at all? Is the basic purpose of prayer to get things from God? Certainly, the Bible assures us that God hears us, and, in response, gives us what we need. But is that the basic reason Jesus taught us to pray? What if God knows prayer to be the thing we need first and foremost? What if the main object in God's idea of prayer is a supplying of our great and endless need—our need of Himself.
