Assurance of Pardon Micah 7:18-19 ESV Who is a God like You, pardoning iniquity and passing over transgression for the remnant of His inheritance? He does not retain His anger forever, because He delights in steadfast love. He will again have compassion on us; He will tread our iniquities underfoot. You will cast all our sins into the depths of the sea.

COMMUNION

• Communion, also called the Lord's Supper or the Eucharist, is the family meal of Christians when we recall Jesus's cross, relive His anguish, and renew our vows to live as His followers.

- We invite all to participate in this meal: who profess faith in Jesus Christ, who are members of a gospel-proclaiming church, who are endeavoring to live at peace with God and others, and who seek strengthening grace to live more faithfully for Jesus.
- If you are not yet a follower of Jesus, we encourage you to spend this time considering Jesus's broken body and shed blood. Pray and ask Him to forgive your sins and to give you eternal life.

PRAYER OF BELIEF Lord Jesus, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever imagined, but, through You, I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank You for paying my debt, for bearing my punishment on the cross and offering me forgiveness and eternal life. Knowing that You have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and receive You as my Savior and Lord. Amen.
