## Worship Reflection

"And they said, 'Let us rise up and build.'
So they strengthened their hands for the good work"
(Nehemiah 2:18 ESV).

Charles Haddon Spurgeon urges us to cultivate a similar zeal for God's work:

"When the hand of the Lord is with us, it should stir up our hearts to bold action.

The people responded with courage because Nehemiah's faith was contagious, teaching us that true leadership inspires others to do great things for God."

Nehemiah was a big-godder whose confidence was not in human ability but in God's provision and power.

The task at hand was too big for him, and so he highlighted where his hope for success was anchored:

"The God of heaven will make us prosper, and we His servants will arise and build" (2:20). As followers of Christ, we are called to rise and build, participating in His enterprise to make disciples of Christ and build His church. But "unless the Lord builds the house, those who build it labor in vain" (Psalm 127:1).
