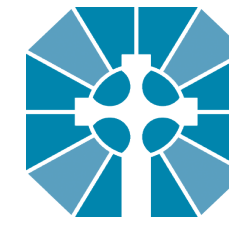

WORSHIP REFLECTION

In our sermon text today, Nehemiah demonstrates the fruit of his relationship with the Lord, not only in his refusal to lord it over those he governs (5:14–18), but also in his personal communion with God (v. 19). He understood the great commands: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind," and "love your neighbor as yourself" (Matthew 22:35–40). Nehemiah's leadership would one day be filled out and perfected in Jesus, who supremely refused to lord it over others, despite His right to do so as Lord of the cosmos (Mark 10:45).
