Worship Reflection

Today is Epiphany Sunday.

The word epiphany comes from a Greek word meaning "manifestation or appearance."

In church history this word is closely associated with the revelation of Jesus Christ in connection with the visit of the Magi.

Epiphany is regularly observed on the Sunday closest to January 6.

What is the significance of the epiphany of our Lord? We cannot know the Lord in a saving way apart from Him revealing Himself to us. The Apostle Paul writes to Titus: "But when the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared, He saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to His own mercy" (*Titus 3:4-5a ESV*).
