Worship Reflection

Our sermon text reminds us of three aspects of worship:

- Worship begins with preparation. John the Baptist's ministry was one of preparation calling people to repentance and readiness for the arrival of Jesus. In the same way, worship is not something into which we stumble, but it is a sacred privilege for which we prepare our hearts.
- 2. Worship calls us to repentance. John's message centered on repentance for the forgiveness of sins. (Mark 1:4) Worship is not just about praise; it is about turning back to God.
- 3. Worship is about seeing God's glory. John's mission was to prepare the way for the Lord so that people could recognize the glory of Christ. True worship lifts our eyes beyond ourselves to behold the majesty of Jesus.

PRAYER OF PREPARATION Lord, as we come before You, help us to prepare our hearts, turn from sin, and behold Your glory. May our worship be pleasing to You, and may we leave transformed and spiritually strengthened by beholding Your beauty, experiencing Your nearness, and tasting Your goodness. Through Jesus Christ our Lord, we pray. Amen.

Call to Worship

Hebrews 1:1-3a ESV

Pastor: Long ago, at many times and in many ways, God spoke to our fathers by the prophets, but in these last days He has spoken to us by His Son, Whom He appointed the heir of all things, through Whom also He created the world.

Affirmation of Faith

Since the time of ancient Israel, believers have confessed their faith publicly (Deut 6:4). Following this practice, we confess our faith each week, using the historic creeds and symbols of the church for the past two thousand years.

Confession of Sin

Within the context of our relationship with God, we are invited in safety, not in shame, to confess our sins. We rehearse this truth each week by confessing our sins corporately, then silently. As we do, we learn that God is always ready to forgive us.

Assurance of Pardon

Scripture assures us, sinners saved by grace, that we are united to Jesus in His death and Resurrection.

AFFIRMATION OF FAITH adapted from The Westminster Confession of Faith, Ch. 15

Repentance unto life is a saving grace, produced in the heart of a sinner by the Spirit and Word of God, whereby we so grieve for and hate our sins and turn from them all to God, purposing and endeavoring to walk with Him in all the ways of new obedience. We ought not to content ourselves with a general repentance, but it is each person's duty to endeavor to repent of his particular sins. Every man is bound to make private confession of his sins to God, praying for pardon.

Confession of Sin

Father, thank you for awakening our hearts to answer the cry in our own personal wilderness to "prepare the way of the Lord." In us, the rough places are to be made smooth, the crooked straight, the mountains of pride brought low, and the valleys of despondency lifted up. Level all obstructions in our hearts so that Your King might receive a glad welcome and reign there without rival. Lift us up out of our discouragements and despondencies, for they are valleys that You must exalt. Banish from our hearts all manner of proud conceit for it is a mountain that You must make low. Prepare the way in us now, and may we welcome anew King Jesus. Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord. Amen.

After making purification for sins, He sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high. . . Hebrews 1:3b ESV

Doxology

A doxology is a hymn or word of praise to God for His goodness and glory.
