Worship Reflection

Confession of sin is a key expression of repentance.

The people responded to John the Baptizer's call by openly confessing their sins, symbolizing a break from their old ways and a readiness for the Messiah.

To confess our sins is to humbly agree with God about our sin, to turn from it in repentance, and to trust His promise of forgiveness through Christ.

Why do we regularly confess our sins?
The discipline of confession
helps us grasp the wonder of grace
and our need for God's mercy.
Christopher Ash reminds us:
"We confess to encourage self-examination
that leads to daily repentance,
not morbid introspection that leads to despair."
Do not let confession lead you to despair.
God promises: "I have swept away your offenses like a cloud. . .
Return to me, for I have redeemed you" (Isaiah 44:22).

Corporate confession prompts personal reflection and honest repentance.

One of the most encouraging moments in worship is the assurance of pardon:

". . .if your faith is in Jesus Christ, then God assures you by His Word that your sins are forgiven."

Prepare your heart for worship by remembering how deeply forgiven and loved you are by our Lord.

Call to Worship

Jesus taught His disciples this prayer as a model (Matt. 6:6-13, Luke 11:2-4), so Christians have recited it through the ages in worship, both as pattern for prayer and as a common prayer for God's people.

Affirmation of Faith

Since the time of ancient Israel, believers have confessed their faith publicly (Deut. 6:4). Following this practice, we confess our faith each week, using the historic creeds and symbols of the church for the past two thousand years.

Affirmation of Faith Westminster Shorter Catechism Q&A 85

Pastor: What does God require of us, that we may escape His wrath and curse due to us for sin?

People: To escape the wrath and curse of God due to us for sin, God requires of us faith in Jesus Christ, repentance unto life, with the diligent use of all the outward means whereby Christ communicates to us the benefits of redemption.

Confession of Sin Within the

context of our relationship with God, we are invited in safety, not in shame, to confess our sins. We rehearse this truth each week by confessing our sins corporately, then silently. As we do, we learn that God is always ready to forgive us.

Assurance of Pardon Scripture assures us sinners saved

us, sinners saved by grace, that we are united to Jesus in His death and Resurrection.

We come before You, confessing our sins,
for we have wandered from Your ways,
clinging to pride, selfishness, and indifference.
We have failed to love You with all of our hearts,
and we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves.

Wash us and make us clean by Jesus's precious blood.
Prepare our hearts to demonstrate Your sacrificial love,
and to walk in the newness of life You freely give.
