WORSHIP REFLECTION

Today, we have the immense privilege of celebrating the Lord's Supper. In this meal, Jesus gives Himself to us and would have us yield ourselves fully to Him. The lessons of the Supper are multiple. It is a feast of remembrance, covenant, and love.

During communion, we participate in an activity that commemorates a past event and looks forward to a future consummation. It is a memorial of faith and a declaration of hope that Christ has died, Christ has risen, and Christ will come again. It calls us to meditate on a crucified Savior's love. a living Savior's intercession, and a coming Savior's glory.

We come to the Lord's Table not because we are strong, but because we are weak. We come because we need God's mercy and help. We come because we love the Lord and want to experience more of His love. Therefore, we lift up our hearts and minds above our cares and fears. and let this bread and wine be to us the token and pledge of the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God the Father, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit,

all meant for us if we will receive them in humble faith.

- Communion, also called the Lord's Supper or the Eucharist, is the family meal of Christians when we recall Jesus's cross, relive His anguish, and renew our vows to live as His followers.
- We invite all to participate in this meal:
 who profess faith in Jesus Christ,
 who are members of a gospel-proclaiming church,
 who are endeavoring to live at peace with God and others,
 and who seek strengthening grace to live more faithfully for Jesus.
- If you are not yet a follower of Jesus, we encourage you to spend this time considering Jesus's broken body and shed blood.
 Pray and ask Him to forgive your sins and to give you eternal life.

Communion Reflection

The Apostle Paul urges all believers who come to the Lord's table to examine themselves before taking communion: "Everyone ought to examine themselves before they eat of the bread and drink from the cup." (1 Corinthians 11:28)

The below is a guide for confession of sin called "The Traits of the Self-Life." Please use it to prepare your hearts to participate in the Lord's Supper. As you read, examine yourself in the presence of God and ask the Holy Spirit to help you identify, confess, and hate pride, selfishness, and rebellion in your life. Are you ever conscious of . . .

- A secret spirit of pride? An exalted feeling in view of your success or position; because of your good training, appearance, or success; because of your natural gifts and abilities?
- An important, independent spirit? Love of human praise; a secret fondness to be noticed; love of supremacy, drawing attention to self in conversation?
- The stirrings of anger or impatience, which, worst of all, you call nervousness or holy indignation; a touchy, sensitive spirit; a disposition to resent or retaliate when disapproved of or contradicted; a desire to throw sharp, heated flings at another?
- An argumentative, talkative spirit; harsh, sarcastic expressions; a headstrong disposition?
- A commanding spirit; a disposition to criticize and pick flaws when set aside and unnoticed?
- Carnal fear; a man-fearing spirit; a shrinking from reproach and duty?
- A jealous disposition, a secret spirit of envy shut up in your heart; a disposition to speak of the faults and failings of others, rather than affirming their gifts and virtues?
- Unbelief; a spirit of discouragement in times of pressure and opposition?

By prayer, hold your heart open to the searchlight of our gracious Father until you see His Spirit softening your heart and resolve to confess these traits and ask the Spirit to replace them with His fruit. (*Galatians 5:22-23*)

Rejoice knowing that Jesus Himself bore all of your sins in His body on the cross, so that we might die to sins and live for righteousness. (1 Peter 2:24)

Call upon the Holy Spirit to empower you to put your "self-life" to death; beseech the Lord, like David did: "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me." (Psalm 51:10)

Oh, to be saved from myself, dear Lord; oh, to be lost in Thee; oh, that it might be no more I, but Christ Who lives in me. Amen.
