by what we have done, and by what we have left undone.**

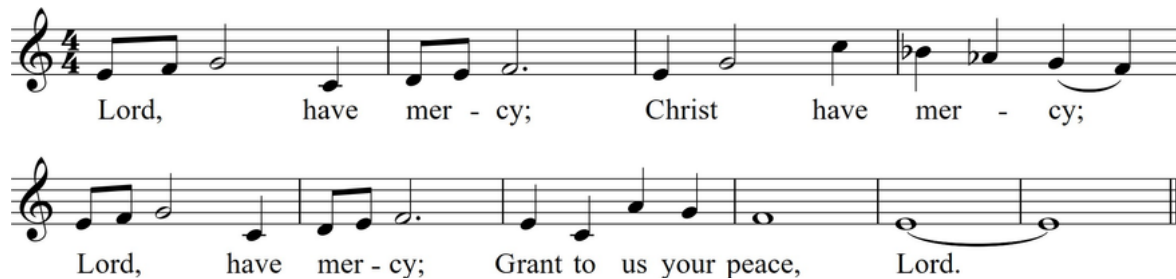
