Update on Gaza and the West Bank:


Protests around the world in response to starvation and bombing of Palestinians in Gaza and bulldozing refugee camps in the West Bank by the Israeli Government.

- 13 Airlines suspend flight to Israel including Delta, Austrian, British Airways, Swiss, Airfrance, Lufthansa, Brussels, AirEuropa, Eurowings, ITA Airways, Iberia, WTZZ, Ryanair
- United Nation's top humanitarian official delivered his assessment of Israel's barbaric war against the Palestinian people, intentionally making life unlivable in Gaza.
- Norway's sovereign wealth fund announced that it has divested entirely from Israel's Paz Oil Company Ltd., citing ethical concerns.
- The Spanish prime minister, Pedro Sanchez described Israel as a "genocidal state" and said Spain "does not do business with such a country," marking his strongest language yet on the issue.
- Norwegian hotel cancels Israeli tourist booking over Gaza genocide.
- University of San Francisco has announced it will divest from Israel.

Show support of the Palestinian families and children for water, food, medial assistance, and the end of the bombing.

Pilgrim Fellowship 2024—2025 Year in Review

The 2024–2025 Pilgrim Fellowship program began with enthusiasm and a deep sense of purpose, setting the tone for a year filled with connection, service, and spiritual growth. The journey started with an overnight retreat at the peaceful Killam's Point, where leaders built bonds through reflection, shared meals, and fun activities. This spirit of community carried over into our Opening Picnic, where returning members warmly welcomed newcomers. Students shared treats, played icebreaker games, and began forging friendships, while parents engaged with our program through stories and presentations by the director.

Thanks to a generous grant from the Guilford Fund for Education, Pilgrim Fellowship embarked on 11 trips into the woods as part of our environmental service initiative. I had the privilege of leading groups along the trails of the Guilford Land Conservation Trust's Tanner Marsh Brook property. Together, we identified and removed invasive plant species, while also taking time to appreciate the beauty of nature and reflect on our responsibility as stewards of the earth.



In early fall, our members participated in the CROP Hunger Walk, proudly walking from First Church to the town dock and back, raising nearly \$350 for hurricane relief kits through our partnership with Church World Service. The glowing accessories worn by our walkers mirrored the enthusiasm and solidarity of our group.

October brought intellectual and ethical exploration when Dr. Kate Ott joined us for a powerful session on gender and stereotypes. Her presentation challenged students to reflect on their assumptions and inspired dialogue around inclusive language and social awareness.

As leaves fell, Pilgrim Fellowship students engaged in a beloved community tradition—leaf raking for local families. Armed with rakes, tarps, and leaf blowers, they worked side-by-side under sunny skies, embodying teamwork and generosity.

PF RECAP CONTINUED

December was a whirlwind of joy and fundraising. We hosted our annual Santa Breakfast, Soup & Bread Dinner, and Holiday Cookie Sale—all made possible by the hard work of our students and the generosity of our community. These festive events not only brought people together but also helped raise funds for our anticipated spring service trip.

Throughout winter, our group continued its mission of learning and service. A visit from Adult & Teen Challenge offered profound insights into addiction recovery, sparking heartfelt conversations and compassion among students. We balanced these deep moments with levity, enjoying fun activities like Minute to Win It, where laughter and teamwork took center stage.

Spring break marked the pinnacle of our service efforts. Forty-eight Pilgrim Fellowship members, supported by 14 adult volunteers, traveled to Johnstown for a transformative mission trip. From building ramps to painting and pavilion construction, our group worked tirelessly to restore homes and uplift spirits. The students not only completed meaningful physical projects, but also formed deep connections with the local community and each other—living out the true meaning of service and compassion.

Upon returning, we shared our journey with the community at our heartfelt Sharefest, a night filled with gratitude and storytelling. Our final meeting celebrated our graduating seniors, honoring their leadership and contributions as they prepare to carry forward the values of Pilgrim Fellowship into the next chapters of their lives.

This year has been one of growth, purpose, and profound impact. To our adult volunteers, Dr. Ginger Brasher-Cunningham, and the families who support our mission—thank you. Together, we've nurtured a generation of thoughtful, kind, and service-driven leaders.

New /Old Business: Visioning is working on a Purpose Statement. PAJ held brunch for Rosette neighborhood to support tiny houses. North Madison CC will join us in our duffel bag ministry. Financial Secretary started a conversation with our IT team regarding improved security in our technology.

Praise Report: peony planted last year is ready to bloom; beautiful landscaping done and tended by Spencer House tenants; son and fiancée closed on a house; friend as guest preacher on Sunday.
