our lives about which I'd like to challenge our senior adults this Advent season is the area of forgiveness. Whom do you need to forgive before the year ends? Here's what forgiveness is not: forgiveness is NOT accepting what was done to you; forgiveness is NOT calling bad good; forgiveness is NOT becoming friends with the person who wronged you. Forgiveness is letting go of your desire to get even and instead giving that person over to God, trusting that He will handle things in the right way. The reason we forgive is because God has forgiven us, and so we forgive others because we know that the Lord has been merciful to us. God is not done with us yet, and when we forgive others, we step further into the joyful future God has for us.
