Suffering Servant Prophecy

This week's lesson is about the Isaiah 42:1-4; 49:6-7; 50:4-7; 52:13-53.

'Isaiah prophesied that because of continued idolatry, God would send Judah into Babylonian captivity, yet He would graciously restore them through the work of His Servant—who would bear their sins by His death so His kingdom would be unending.'

We refer to the following scriptures as 'Servant Songs' (not really songs) for the purpose of this lesson: 1. Isaiah 42:1-4; 2. Isaiah 49:6-7; 3. Isaiah 50:4-7; 4. Isaiah 52:13-53.

- 1. 'The first song identifies the Servant as chosen by the Lord and equipped by the Spirit to fulfill His responsibilities. He will work peaceably and gently to establish justice and point the nations to the one true God.'
- 2. 'The second song reinforces the idea that the Servant will move beyond the nation of Israel and extend His mission to all nations.'
- 3. 'The third song describes the Servant's obedience and steadfast endurance, even under extreme persecution. Because the Servant is disciplined, he is able to teach others about God. His teaching brings about persecution, but He does not waver in His loyalty to God or His mission.'
- 4. 'The fourth song is perhaps one of the best-known passages in Scripture. All but one verse of Chapter 53 are quoted in a variety of New Testament passages. This song describes the Servant's sacrifice for our sins, His triumph over suffering, and His future glory.' 'Verses 10-12 imply the Servant's resurrection and declare His death as His noblest achievement, the means by which many are reconciled to God.'

'Yet the Servant's sacrifice does not mean automatic atonement for everyone's sins. Only those who through faith admit their sins, believe the Servant died for their sins, and confess their faith in Him as Savior receive forgiveness.'

'Isaiah's Servant Songs found their ultimate fulfillment in the life, death, and resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ, the Savior of the world.'

Bible Verse: The Lord has punished him for the iniquity of us all. Isaiah 53:6

<u>Life Application</u>: I will tell others how Jesus provided salvation from our sins.
