## Jeremiah's Calling

This week's lesson is about Jeremiah 1:1-19

While Josiah was king of Judah, God chose Jeremiah to warn the people of Judah. Jeremiah would preach against sin, deliver messages of impending judgment as well as messages of hope and renewal to the people of Judah.

'Now the word of the Lord came to me, saying, "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, and before you were born I dedicated you for divine purpose; I appointed you a prophet to the nations."' Jeremiah said, "Ah, Lord God! Behold, I do not know how to speak, for I am only a youth." God answered Jeremiah: "No excuses, Jeremiah. You will go where I tell you to go. You will say what I tell you to say. Have courage. Do not be afraid of anyone. I will be with you." Then the Lord put out his hand and touched my mouth. And the Lord said to me, "Behold, I have put my words in your mouth. See, I have set you this day over nations and over kingdoms, to pluck up and to break down (preach against sin), to destroy and to overthrow (messages of judgment), to build and to plant (messages of hope and renewal)." And the word of the Lord came to me, saying, "Jeremiah, what do you see?" And I said, "I see an almond branch." Then the Lord said to me, "You have seen well, for I am **watching** over my word to perform it."

The word of the Lord came to me a second time, saying, "What do you see?" And I said, "I see a boiling pot, facing away from the north." This picture meant Judah's enemies would attack and destroy the nation. God was going to let this happen because the people kept turning away from Him. "...And I will declare my judgments against them, for all their evil in forsaking me."

"Go, Jeremiah," God said. "Tell the people I am going to judge them for worshipping other gods. Have **courage**. I will make you strong. I will be with you." "They will fight against you, but they shall not prevail against you, for I am with you, declares the Lord, to deliver you."

*Jeremiah would face beatings, imprisonment, being mocked and scorned, as well as plots against his life but God delivered him from all of it. He served God well through great trials for 40 years. May we, too, serve God courageously despite the trials of life.*

**Bible Verse:** Be strong, and let your heart be courageous, all you who put your hope in the Lord. Psalm 31:24

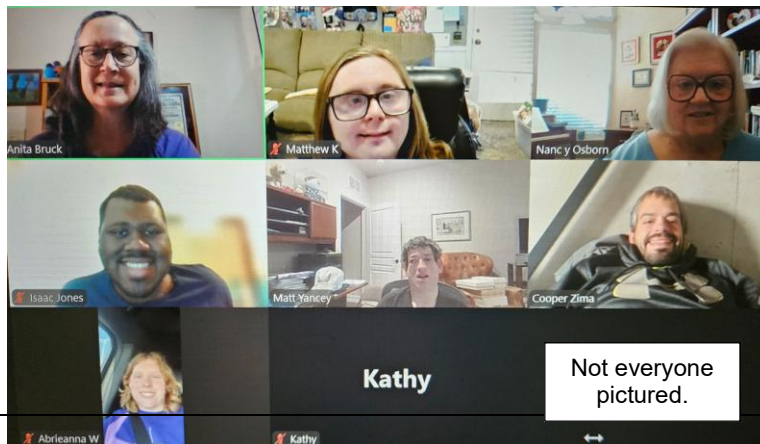
**Life Application:** I will have the courage to do what God wants me to do.
