What is your resurrection story?

Do you know what I'm talking about? You know... that time when the mighty acts of God in Jesus Christ transformed your life...where you experienced the grace of God in some profound, life-changing way...where grace became real and full of hope?

What is your resurrection story?

When push comes to shove, the good news that we are called to share with the world is best shared through our own stories and experiences. Why? Because our stories of grace are real. In our stories, grace is not a theological concept, an ideology, an archaic idea, or some legalistic, religious metaphor; it's something that has ultimately changed our lives and our communities for the better. In these stories, people can relate, can see the power and promise of God's love in Jesus Christ.

So...what is your resurrection story?

Do you know how to tell it? Do you know how to share it in such a way that others see its life-giving impact?

Every time we come to Easter, I'm reminded of my resurrection stories. It's like I am pushed back to those moments where Jesus transformed my life, almost like I'm reliving them. The potency and energy, the joy and gratitude, the hope and promise of eternity seem to overwhelm me, so much so that I don't just feel called to share the gospel, I can't help but tell everyone about how Jesus changed my life.

But where to start?

It begins with that question I keep posing: What is your resurrection story(s)?

As we continue to celebrate and remember the hope and promise of Easter, I challenge each of you to articulate your resurrection story(s). Write them out. Remember them. Give thanks to God for them. Let them fill you again with that feeling of overwhelming joy and gratitude. Perhaps someone out there needs to hear your story. Maybe it can be the catalyst for another's journey towards God's wide-open arms. Maybe it's the best evangelism tool you will ever have.

I just wanted to say thank you for the dress-out clothes you folks sent for my upcoming release from San Quentin.

I was expecting to be released to a transitional house in Oakland, because my support system, job prospects and resources are centered here in the Bay Area. Today I received a notice that I am being sent somewhere else instead: Bakersfield.

I do not know why this is happening. I have never lived in Bakersfield; I have no family, resources, or sypport there. My parents both died during my incarceration, and I have no one in the world.

Then I received your card, with your simple message, that God is with me everywhere.

God bless you for your kindness, because you have no idea how powerful these words are, and how timely. I am in tears as I type this. I was beginning to panic; in fact, my heart is still beating hard. But I have reassurance now, from someone I've never even met, that no matter where they send me, not only will God be waiting to meet me there, he will be holding my fearful hand all along the way.

Thank you so much, for the clothes, and especially for your generosity of spirit. I hope and pray that God blesses you a thousand fold what you have blessed me with.

We are grateful for those who took the time to return the "How did we do?" survey. 100% of you said you believed the drill was a success overall! We also appreciate the thoughtful feedback we received. Your comments will go a long way in helping us to improve our emergency response plans.

The Christian Education committee is sponsoring a new spring/summer adult learning opportunity: "The Dead Sea Scrolls," a series of 24 video lectures via Zoom that presents the discovery, translation, and significance of ancient scrolls found at Qumran in 1947.

The videos are produced by The Teaching Company as one of its "Great Courses" series, and feature Dr. Gary Rendsburg, Ph.D., chair of the department of Jewish Studies at Rutgers University.

The scrolls shed light on Jewish culture and theology at the time of Christ and also raise issues about the transmittal of the Biblical record across time. Weekly sessions will cover two thirty minute lectures and discussion led by Walt Campbell. Twelve sessions are scheduled for Saturdays at 10:30 a.m. from March 23 to June 8.



The Gospel of John

In the Sermon on the Mount (The Gospel of Matthew, chapters 5 through 7), Jesus instructs his disciples to repay evil with blessing. Can you put on the mind of the Lord and return only good for evil?

Women's Bible Study invites all women to know Jesus better and in a personal way as we study the Gospel of John – God's love letter to the world.

The first 12 chapters focus on the signs/miracles that Jesus performs. Presently we are in Chapter 13 where Jesus is exclusively with His disciples explaining the difficulties looming ahead: betrayal, parting words, the Lord's Prayer, condemnation, crucifixion and resurrection.

In class we discuss that Jesus knew who He was, where He was from and what power and authority He had.

Join us on Zoom Thursdays from 10 to 11:30 a.m. with Carol Dacquisto leading the study, using the NavPress "Life Changes" study guide. Our next study will be Joshua.

Our dedicated project for more than 40 years is Tabs for Kids – collecting pop tabs from aluminum cans from PC members, friends and neighbors. They are donated to the Shriners Hospital for Children in Sacramento which sells them to a recycling company. Proceeds are used to assist parents' families with care expenses.

The quarter (March, April, May) is entitled "Examining Our Faith." In this quarter, we will explore the fullness of faith as a response to God's desire to be in relationship with us. What can today's Christians draw from these ancient accounts that will help us grow more deeply in faith?

Unit 2, lessons from Luke and Matthew discuss the range of Christian faith.

The lessons in **Unit 3** from Romans encourage believers to continue standing in the faith.
