"Faithful Invitation & Shepherding"

What is the #1 reason people invest in a faith community long term? My guess is that you all know the answer because it's the reason you've been at PCN for many years. Sure, some part of us would say it's our worship services, our music, our classes, etc. But the answer most of us would give is this: we are here because of the community of people, the friends we have, the relationships we've developed.

And that makes perfect sense. Church is a body of believers, seeking to get to know and follow Jesus. We can't be Church by ourselves. Church is a body of people who love one another, need each other, go out of their way to care for and support one another. Church is a community in which we can be ourselves, authentically us, and be loved and accepted. People stay and invest in a church community because they find their sense of belonging there.

This is no secret. I think we've known this about Church since Jesus commissioned us. But in our world today, people around us need an extra push, tug, or nudge to discover Church. The Church has developed a bad rap over the years and people have searched and found places of belonging outside the Church. The Church doesn't have the influence it once did. It's not as prominent in society and doesn't hold the cultural power that it used to. Nowadays, people have to be persuaded to even step into a church community. And even then, they are dubious about the institution itself and easily looking for the nefarious Church they've heard so much about. When people visit churches, they usually have one foot still out the door.

So what does this mean for the Church today and for PCN? Well, it means that, from the get-go, if people explore a church community, they have to see, experience, and understand why Church matters to them, why it is valuable, and why they might stick around ... and they have to see this within the first visit (or before). They have to realize, straightaway, that God loves them, that the community loves them, will bend over backwards for them, will be there for them. They have to realize that the community is a safe place for their family, that it is a breath of fresh air from the grind of everyday life, that this community can enrich their lives.

But how can all of that happen in the first visit?

It begins with an invitation to join worship, a class, a program, or some event. But it's not just any kind of invitation we are called to extend, rather an invitation with the intent to shepherd. It's no arbitrary thing when we invite our neighbors to join us. It's an invitation to experience the grace of God in Jesus Christ in and through the Church. And what is the Church? The Church is the Body of Christ, the community of faith built on the relationships we have with God and each other. So, the invitation itself should take on the characteristics of the type of relationship Jesus draws us into; the type of relationship where people give of themselves for the sake of someone else, where we go out of the way for each other.

So when we invite people to church events, we should be ready with the intent to invite them to join 'us/me.' In other words, the plan should be to do this thing **together.** We should expect those we invite to journey with us, and for us to shepherd them into the life and ministry of the Church. We have to put on display from the beginning that they matter, they're worth our time, and we think the Church will change their lives like it has ours.

As a congregation at PCN, we have something special as a community, something we think is worth sharing with the world. And we want people to join us. So in 2025, the challenge for each of us is to invite one person or family per month to join us for some church event, worship, class, etc. But that invitation should not be a simple 'ask,' but rather the invitation to 'accompany me' to that event. We should invite with the expectation of shepherding.

At first, this might mean having them accompany you. And later on it might lead to connecting them with other people in the church and other programs and ministries. But it is the *relationships* that matter and building up the body of Christ in community together.

What do you think, my friends? Can we develop a culture of invitation and shepherding in 2025? I know we can. Let's do it together!

Imagine the pain of losing your home and everything in it: the sadness and sense of complete loss, and even the loss of friends and family. We at PCN had to do something and in *one week* we did! In response to the *urgent* emergency email call-to-action to the congregation, SIXTY PCN Hearts pitched in on Thursday, January 16 and in *one* hour "filled the order"! We put together 40 prayer blankets and shipped them off to Pastor Grace of Pacific Palisades Presbyterian Church, which was destroyed in the fires. As you read this, PCN Prayer Blankets have been handed out to fire victims!

Message from Pastor Grace:

"Please thank everyone, from the bottom of my heart, and please let them know that this ministry is so incredibly important at this time for everyone who is suffering from deep trauma.

I'll tell you a wonderful point of irony: our church has a knitting blanket ministry ... a small group of women from our church ... I distribute them to folks who are coming out of hospitals or who are dying, and this has been an incredible ministry of our church. Each holiday season, we deliver them to hospitals as well. And now, our church folks will be receiving these blankets that they have been giving to people for years.

We have a tremendous number of people in our little church who have lost their homes. This is a wonderful, wonderful gift for those in our church. Please thank everyone again and give them our heartfelt gratitude!

May peace be the journey."



Carol's spoken plan for the future of Women's Bible Study was to pass on leadership to class members, and we have done that by adding Melodie Baird to our teaching team.
