“Returning to Our True Self: The Lenten Journey”

I dread going into the garage because it is a constant reminder that many things we thought we needed over the years now sit unattended, unused, unseen. It is also a reminder that the same things we thought we needed are still emotionally attached to us. So much so that, even though they are mere dust collectors, we cannot bring ourselves to give them away or host a garage sale to resell them. I am sure none of you can relate, or perhaps, as I suspect, all of us avoid our garages. What if I told you that, like your garage, there are parts of your soul, parts of your inner life, that you choose not to reflect on. That you choose not to attend to, that there is a particular kind of spiritual self-care that you and I avoid. And that, in the wisdom of God, there is a season each year where God invites you and me to slow down, to walk into the garage of your soul, to behold yourself fully.

Lent is a season in the Christian liturgical calendar that invites you back into the dark, dusty garage of your soul. To see every corner of your being, to tend to those things you have forgotten. Lent is patterned after Jesus’s 40 days of temptation in the desert, and Israel’s 40 years of desert trials. While Lent is commonly associated with acts of self-denial, I believe this association misses the true meaning of the season: that Lent is an invitation to return to our true selves. To slow down, to walk through, and sometimes climb through the garage of our soul. Opening boxes, beholding contents we have long forgotten, helps prepare us so that as we approach Holy Week, Christ’s passion and resurrection, we can give ourselves fully and completely to God. Lent is an invitation to “surrender to love. Fall into goodness. His arms are wide open, waiting to catch you” (Chuck DeGroat, *Falling Into Goodness: Lenten Reflections*).

I want you to consider that Lent is not a season designed to show you how sinful you are, how much vice is hidden away in those cardboard boxes and cloth-draped pieces of unused furniture. ***Lent is not a season to show you your sin; it is a season to show you the glory, dignity, and purpose God has made you for.***

As my friend and first doctoral Advisor, Chuck DeGroat writes,

What if instead of seeing your ‘sinful behavior’ as the big problem, you shifted your focus [during Lent] to your original goodness? What if instead of imagining God’s disappointment in your lack of discipline you imagined God smiling at his very image in you.

I think Chuck is right. The purpose of the season of Lent is not to simply take things out of your life in response to how sinful or broken or needy you are. Rather, these forty days are an invitation to see

your true self, fully and wholly. All the parts of your story – your struggles, your desires – that you and I have left in the taped-shut boxes of our souls. You were made in the image of God: the beauty of that image is enduring; the glory of God is present amidst the boxes that each of us is slow to return to you. Lent is an invitation to fall back into goodness, to behold the beauty of God within yourself, and to grow desirous of seeing the beauty of God within your neighbor.

As we begin the season of Lent with Ash Wednesday on February 18, I want to offer you three Lenten studies to guide you into the garage of the soul. The first is from my doctoral advisor, who oversaw my Doctor of Ministry degree at Western Theological Seminary in Holland, Michigan. Chuck DeGroat wrote a wonderful little Lenten study called *Falling Into Goodness: Lenten Reflections*. It includes daily readings and prayers. The second Lenten study is from Henri Nouwen's musings on Lent, collected in the book *Lent and Easter Wisdom from Henri J.M. Nouwen*. Lastly, for those who want a longer read that includes reflections from a wide array of Christian authors on Lent, I have found the compilation of readings in *Bread and Wine: Readings for Lent and Easter* to be very helpful.

May you return to your true self during the season of Lent. May you behold the love and beauty with which God has filled your story. My dear friends, you were made from dust, but you were made for glory!



Session

Session Highlights – January 2026

At the January 21, 2026 Stated Session meeting:

- Session approved soliciting the congregation for a voluntary Love Offering to thank Tammi Jester for serving as the PCN Office Administrator. Love Offering gifts should be given directly to Tammi and are not tax-deductible.
- Session approved a 2026 Base Budget of \$879,158. Estimated pledge giving is down from 2025. Finance & Administration may change the budget as 2026 progresses based on income received. A year deficit is possible if giving remains weak.
- Session approved the Music Director's request to purchase instruments/speakers and software to replace our musicians' personal equipment, not to exceed \$11,200 and funded by the Operating Reserve. New equipment will be the property of PCN and will be tagged and secured.
- Session approved changing PCN office hours to 9 a.m. to 12 noon, Monday through Thursday.

Pastor Tony and the Property Team reported that:

- Expansion of the media booth in the sanctuary is complete
- Window tinting of the sanctuary will be done January 28-30, 2026. The tinting will provide security of property and congregants and enhance lighting for the sanctuary and livestream of worship services.
- A new media switch has been purchased and will be installed when the window tinting is completed.

These three projects were completed under budget.

From the Clerk: 2026 Per Capita

The per capita amount for 2026 is \$40 per member. This money goes to support the Presbytery Staff (three individuals), PC(USA), and the Synod including mission and ministry work. Each member can pay the \$40 directly to the PCN office with a notation of "2026 Per Capita." PCN budgets and pays the total per capita amount even if each person does not or cannot individually pay. However, as each person pays, this can create additional funds for PCN operations, programs, and mission giving. A flyer from the Presbytery follows. It explains how the per capita funds are distributed and used.

Christensen Room and Trevitt Hall

Did you know that our two meeting rooms, Christensen and Trevitt Hall, were named for former pastors? Many congregants think it is the “Christiansen” room, having been so named for Christianity. But it was actually named after PCN’s first pastor, the Rev. Charles Christensen. He was called as our first pastor in 1915. What is now the Novato Police Station was the manse and built for his family. Unfortunately (and embarrassingly!), there is a plaque above the double-doors to the Christensen room that has his name misspelled! We looked back through the Session books and found his signature, and it is indeed spelled “Christensen.”

Rev. Christensen retired in 1935, and the Rev. David Trevitt was called to the ministry. He resigned in 1942 to become a military chaplain and, sadly, was killed in the war.


To my beloved PCN family,




