I've struggled with composing this *PresPress* article. Knowing that this will be my last as the pastor at PCN has stricken me with a sense of reality and finality. Perhaps the import of this article is no greater than any other article I've written at PCN but there seems to be the pressure to create both some semblance of closure and at the same time the reassurance and hope that PCN carries forward as she follows the Holy Spirit into the future.

But then again, isn't the story of the Church the story of continual transition, rebirth, and resurrection? Isn't the pastor's role always to offer closure and hope time and again throughout the many changes and transitions in life and ministry?

I've realized, over time, that change and transition is pretty much a mainstay when it comes to faithful discipleship. As difficult as change can be, and as resistant as we often are to it, to be a disciple of Jesus IS to be in a continual state of change and transformation. Why? Because we are in a relationship with God. Relationships, necessarily, change us. It's no different with God. God is always working, through the Holy Spirit, to bring us new life; to make us whole; to become more Christ-like. Faith MEANS we are being transformed. To be a Christian is to expect and be ready to go through change at every given moment.

So a pastoral transition is no different. It's the same story.

I look back on my time with PCN with such fondness and gratitude. I know, without a shadow of a doubt, that God led me to shepherd this community. The words from the book of Esther have resonated with me over the years, 'for such a time as this,' did God bring me into the life and ministry of PCN. And together, we navigated the pandemic, spent time in discernment fashioning a sense of identity, implemented a new strategic plan, reoriented our leadership structure, revitalized several of our church spaces, navigated staffing changes, created one worship service that represents the identity of the congregation, began a renewed, intentional focus on community life, etc. With so many unknowns and with such rapid change, we truly navigated a time of wilderness with faithful resolve, careful listening, and no shortage of hope. We said goodbye to old friends, and we welcomed many new disciples. PCN has the same DNA she always had: loving, caring, generous, and grace-filled. But today she is, in many ways, a new community of faith that needs a new shepherd, and I have no doubt that God already has in mind that very person. And for me, God has other plans, and a new community to shepherd.

And so, it is in this mindset that I feel the need to say 'goodbye,' but I do so not with sadness in my heart, but with hope and joy because I have seen the hand of God at work in PCN these past six years, and I know that God will continue that work even after I'm gone. God's got this. God's got y'all!

Session Highlights – June 2025

At the June 18, 2025 meeting:

- Session approved Personnel Elders Tonya Church and Greg Smith, and Elders George Pilloton, Art Plumstead, and Kathy Takemoto to serve as the Interim/Transitional Pastor Search Committee. The Session is responsible for commissioning an Interim/Transitional Search Team. The Presbytery will provide guidance and support.
- Session approved the formation of the Nominating Committee to serve from July 1, 2025, to
 June 30, 2026, which will seek candidates to serve as Elders and Deacons beginning July 1,
 2026. The Nominating Committee will also seek candidates to serve on the Pastor Nominating
 Committee. The Nominating Committee is comprised of two Session Elders, the Vice
 Moderator of the Deacons, and three at-large members from the congregation. Kathy Botko,
 Walt Campbell, and E.B. Hanlein will serve second terms as the at-large members. The Elders
 and Vice Moderator of the Deacons will be determined in the near future.
- The Property Team had two motions:
 - Create a space for those with walkers and wheelchairs in the rear of the sanctuary by removing a pew. This space will contain chairs and space to keep assistive devices close by. This is a temporary change to assess whether it improves the comfort and safety of those using this area. Sitting in this area is optional.
 - Motion to create five handicapped parking spaces west of the power pole. This will eliminate the need to cross the island. A painted crosswalk will be added.

Both motions were approved by Session.

- Reactivation of the Stephen Ministry program and training was proposed. Sally Carbonaro will provide additional information to the Elders for an assessment.
- All congregants are encouraged to provide input on the church's website.
- Coffee service after worship will no longer be handled by the Deacons. As of July 1, 2025, church committees, officers, and Life Groups are asked to sign up for Sundays to provide coffee service. Elders Tonya Church and Karen Marks have obtained a donation from Bunn Coffee Company of two new coffee brewing machines and 15 air pots. This eliminates the need to maneuver coffee urns. Training sessions will be held for all to learn how to easily brew coffee in five to seven minutes into an air pot.
- Session approved the acceptance of voluntary monetary gifts as a Love Offering for the Adam and Sarah Smith family from congregants.





- What information did Judas communicate to betray Jesus and what motivated him?


